On the basis of information furnished by the registrant, the above named pesticide is hereby registered/reregistered under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act.

Registration is in no way to be construed as an endorsement or recommendation of this product by the Agency. In order to protect health and the environment, the Administrator, on his motion, may at any time suspend or cancel the registration of a pesticide in accordance with the Act. The acceptance of any name in connection with the registration of a product under this Act is not to be construed as giving the registrant a right to exclusive use of the name or to its use if it has been covered by others.

This product is conditionally registered in accordance with FIFRA sec. 3(c)(7)(A) provided that you:

- 1. Submit and/or cite all data required for registration/reregistration of your product when the Agency requires all registrants of similar products to submit such data.
 - 2. Make the following label changes before you release the product for shipment:
 - a. Revise the EPA Registration Number to read, "EPA Reg. No. 59639-123".
 - b. Add a rotational crop restriction to the directions for use on strawberries to prohibit rotation to any non-registered crops following strawberries.
 - c. Add a statement to the directions for use on pome fruits to require that applications to pome fruit should be made in a minimum spray volume of 100 GPA.

d. Revise the Environmental Hazards section to read as follows:

"This pesticide is toxic to freshwater and marine/estuarine aquatic invertebrates, including oysters and shrimp. Do not apply directly to water, or to areas where surface water is present or to intertidal areas below the mean high water mark. Do not apply when weather conditions favor drift from treated areas. Drift and runoff from treated areas may be hazardous to aquatic organisms in water adjacent to treated areas. Do not contaminate water when disposing of equipment washwaters or rinsate."

- e. At the beginning of the list of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) within the Precautionary Statements, add the statements "Some of the materials that are chemical-resistant to this product are listed below. If you want more options, follow the instructions for category A on an EPA chemical-resistance category selection chart." In addition, revise the requirement for "waterproof gloves" to a requirement for "chemical-resistant gloves made of any waterproof material such as polyethylene or polyvinyl chloride."
- f. Within the list of PPE for early re-entry in the Agricultural Use Requirements box, revise the requirement for "waterproof gloves" to a requirement for "chemical-resistant gloves made of any waterproof material."
- 3. Submit the following information to satisfy the data gaps in the data base for etoxazole. The following information is required within two (2) years of the date of this Notice:
 - a. A new confined rotational crop study must be submitted to support the proposed maximum seasonal use rate on strawberry (0.27 lb ai/A).
 - b. A detailed sample history indicating when the samples from the apple metabolism study were extracted and analyzed, and in what form the samples were stored (whole fruits, extracts, etc.) must be submitted. Likewise, the same type of sample history is required for the orange metabolism study.
 - c. A new study must be submitted to address the data requirement for photolysis in water.
 - d. Additional information must be submitted to upgrade the original study addressing the data requirement for photolysis in soil.
 - e. Additional information must be submitted to upgrade the original study addressing the data requirement for adsorption/desorption.
 - f. Additional information must be submitted to upgrade the original study addressing the data requirement for bioaccumulation in fish.

- g. Additional information must be submitted to upgrade the original study addressing the data requirement for avian reproduction.
- h. A new study must be submitted to address the data requirement for acute toxicity to freshwater fish (rainbow trout and bluegill sunfish).
- i. A new study conducted using the end-use product must be submitted to address the data requirement for acute toxicity to aquatic invertebrates.
- j. Two new studies, one conducted using the technical product and one conducted using the end-use product, must be submitted to address the data requirements for acute toxicity to marine/estuarine mollusks.
- k. A new study conducted using the end-use product must be submitted to address the data requirement for acute toxicity to marine/estuarine shrimp.
- 1. A new study must be submitted to address the data requirement for the Daphnia life-cycle.
- m. Additional information must be submitted to upgrade the original study addressing the data requirement for the mysid shrimp life-cycle.
- n. A new study must be submitted to address the data requirement for chronic sediment testing.
- o. Additional information must be submitted to upgrade the original study addressing the data requirement for oyster bioconcentration factor.
- p. Additional information must be submitted to upgrade the original study addressing the data requirement for aquatic plant growth.
- 4. Submit one copy of the revised final printed label for the record before you release the product for shipment.

If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA sec. 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product constitutes acceptance of these conditions.
