Treat each over-wintering hive with 1.8 ounces (50 grams) of menthol during the period late August to early December when there is no surplus honey flow and daytime temperatures are expected to reach at least 60 degrees Fahrenheit.

Menthol should be enclosed in approximately a 7 inch square plastic screening or similar porous packet placed on the top bars or on the bottom board of the over-wintering hive. Menthol placed on the top bars is the preferred method of treatment at temperatures <u>below a daytime high of 80 degrees Fahrenheit</u>. If daytime high is above 80 degrees Fahrenheit, place the menthol packet on the bottom board. Replace the packets in the overwintering hive with fresh packets as needed to maintain menthol in the hive.



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
