Note: Changes in labeling differing in substance from that accepted in connection with this registration must be submitted to and accepted by the Registration Division prior to use of the label in commerce. In any correspondence on this product always refer to the above EPA registration number.

On the basis of information furnished by the registrant, the above named pesticide is hereby registered/reregistered under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act.

Registration is in no way to be construed as an endorsement or recommendation of this product by the Agency. In order to protect health and the environment, the Administrator, on his motion, may at any time suspend or cancel the registration of a pesticide in accordance with the Act. The acceptance of any name in connection with the registration of a product under this Act is not to be construed as giving the registrant a right to exclusive use of the name or to its use if it has been covered by others.

This product is conditionally registered in accordance with FIFRA sec. 3(c)(7)(A) provided that you:

I. Submit and/or cite all data required for registration/reregistration of your product under FIFRA sec. 3(c)(5) when the Agency requires all registrants of similar products to submit such data; and submit acceptable responses required for reregistration of your product under FIFRA section 4.

II. Make the labeling changes listed below for both the outer and inner (placepack) packages before you release the product for shipment:

A. Revise the EPA Registration Number to read, "EPA Reg. No. 61282-23.

B. Amend the qualifying statement on the proposed outer package label for the 8-pack size (eight 1.5-oz. placepacks) to read exactly as we indicated in our letter dated August 22, 1995. The modification of the statement on your proposed outer label is NOT acceptable. The statement must read

"The amount of bait contained in the packs in this box is unlikely to be sufficient to kill more than 3 to 12 rats."

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This statement should only appear on the outer label for the 8-pack size. This qualifier is not appropriate for individual placepacks or for any other size of outer package. These placepacks may not be sold individually unless all claims and directions pertaining to the control of rats are deleted. Note that a different (alternate) brand name would be needed if 1.5-oz., mouse-only placepacks were to be sold.

C. Add to the statement of contents on the outer package the number of "1.5-oz. (43-g)" placepacks contained therein, i.e. "NET CONTENTS: Eight 1.5-oz (43-g) placepacks," etc.. Note that our regulations require that weights be "expressed as avoirdupois pounds and ounces." Metric equivalents may follow in parentheses.

D. Amend the "STORAGE AND DISPOSAL" statement on the outer package label and individual placepack labels as indicated below.

- 1) On the proposed individual placepack labels, delete the sentence of directions for "DISPOSAL" and add directions for "STORAGE AND DISPOSAL" as follows:

"STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage or disposal.

PESTICIDE DISPOSAL: Securely wrap wastes resulting from the use of this product in several layers of newspaper and discard in trash.

CONTAINER DISPOSAL: Do not reuse empty container. Wrap container securely in several layers of newspaper and discard in trash."

- 2) On the proposed outer package label under the heading "STORAGE AND DISPOSAL," delete the statement in parentheses "For Inner Containers." In addition, delete the sentence of directions for "DISPOSAL" and add directions for "PESTICIDE DISPOSAL" and "CONTAINER DISPOSAL" to the outer label as indicated below.

- a) If your product is intended for both commercial and household uses, add the following directions:

"PESTICIDE DISPOSAL:

Commercial use: Wastes resulting from the use of this product should be securely wrapped in several layers of newspaper and then disposed of onsite or at an approved waste disposal facility.

Household use: Securely wrap wastes resulting from the use of this product in several layers of newspaper and discard in trash."

"CONTAINER DISPOSAL:

Commercial use: Dispose of empty container in a sanitary landfill, or by incineration, or if allowed by state and local authorities, by burning. If burned, stay out of smoke.

Household use: Do not reuse container. Wrap container securely in several layers of newspaper and discard in trash."

b) If your product is intended either solely for commercial use or solely for household use, the outer package label should only include the appropriate commercial or household disposal directions under "PESTICIDE DISPOSAL" and "CONTAINER DISPOSAL".

III. Placepack penetration data are needed to support the claim for control of mice as well as commensal rats. Your CSF indicates that the subject product is a straight repack of EPA Reg. No. 2393-508, which is registered as a 4-oz. placepack. You indicated in your August 29, 1995 letter that the placepacks for the subject product and for EPA Reg. 2393-508 are made from the same material and that adequate data on placepack penetration by commensal rats are available for EPA Reg. No. 2393-508 (MRIDs 429785-01 and -02). Therefore, placepack penetration data are only needed for mice, and you have indicated that a study will be conducted and submitted by May 1996.

IV. Submit two copies of your revised final printed labeling for both the outer package and individual placepacks before you release the product for shipment.

If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA section 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product bearing the amended labeling constitutes acceptance of these conditions.

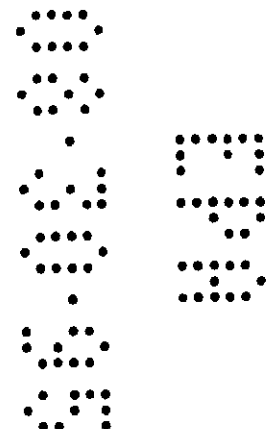

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

READ THIS LABEL: Read this entire label and follow all use directions and use precautions.

IMPORTANT: Do not expose children, pets, or other non-target animals to rodenticides. To help to prevent accidents:

1. Store product not in use in a location out of reach of children and pets.

2. Apply bait in locations out of reach of children, pets, domestic animals and non-target wildlife, or in tamper-resistant bait stations. These stations must be resistant to destruction by dogs and by children under six years of age, and must be used in a manner that prevents such children from reaching into bait compartments and obtaining bait. If bait can be shaken from stations when they are lifted, units must be secured or otherwise immobilized. Even stronger bait stations are needed in areas open to hooved livestock, raccoons, bears, or other potentially destructive animals, or in areas prone to vandalism.

3. Dispose of product container, and unused, spoiled, and unconsumed bait as specified on this label.

USE RESTRICTIONS: For control of Norway rats, roof rats and house mice in and around homes, industrial and agricultural buildings, and similar man-made structures. Do not place bait where there is a possibility of contaminating food or surfaces that come in direct contact with food. Do not broadcast bait.

BACK RIGHT PANEL

SELECTION OF TREATMENT AREAS: Determine areas where rats or mice will most likely find and consume the bait. Generally, these are along walls, by gnawed openings, in or beside burrows, in corners and concealed places, between floors and walls, or in locations where rodents or their signs have been seen. Protect bait from rain or snow. Remove as much alternative food as possible.

APPLICATION DIRECTIONS:

Rats: Apply 3 to 10 bait packs per placement. Maintain an uninterrupted supply of fresh bait for at least 10 days.

Mice: Apply one placepack per placement location. Space placements at 8- to 12- foot intervals. Maintain an uninterrupted supply of fresh bait for at least 15 days.

Rats/Mice: Replace contaminated or spoiled bait immediately.

Collect and dispose of all dead animals and leftover bait properly. To prevent reinfestation, limit sources of rodent food, water, and harborage as much as possible. If reinfestation does occur, repeat treatment. Where a continuous source of infestation is present, establish permanent bait stations and replenish as needed.
