Target Broadleaf Weeds, Application Rate, and Use Restrictions:

Target Broadleaf Weeds	Stinger (pint/acre)	Use Restrictions
buckwheat, wild chamomile clover cocklebur, common dandelion galinsoga lettuce, prickly pineappleweed ragweed smartweed	1/4 - 1/2 (0.09375 - 0.187 lb ai/acre)	 Preharvest Interval: Do not apply within 30 days of harvest. Make one to two broadcast applications per crop per year, not to exceed a total of 1/2 pint per acre (0.187 lb ai/acre) per year. In New York and California, the maximum application rate for Stinger is 2/3 pint per acre per growing season. Do not exceed the cumulative amount of 2/3 pint [0.25 lb acid equivalent (a.e.)] of clopyralid per acre per crop year. In Florida, use only on cabbage, Chinese cabbage (bok choy, napa), and Chinese mustard cabbage (gai choy).

Broadcast Application Rates: Apply uniformly with ground equipment in a minimum of 10 to 40 gallons of water per acre. For suppression of Canada thistle, apply after the majority of basal leaves have emerged but prior to bud stage and at least 30 days prior to harvest.

Tank Mixtures: Stinger may be tank mixed with other herbicides labeled for use on mustard greens. Follow the Directions for Use of the labeling for any tank mix partner used in tank mixture with this product.
