Split Application:

Apply and incorporate TREFLAN in a split application. Make the first application before planting and the second application after plants have fully emerged.

Soil Incorporation: Set equipment so that the bed and furrow are uniformly covered with a layer of treated soil. If the layer of treated soil is not uniform and the herbicide is concentrated over the bed, potato emergence may be retarded and stem brittleness can occur. When applying and incorporating Treflan after potato plants have fully emerged, do not completely cover the plants with treated soil. Likewise, do not completely cover plants during subsequent cultivations. Be careful that incorporation equipment does not damage seed pieces or elongating sprouts.

- Do not apply to soils containing more than 2% organic matter.

Treflan/Eptam Tank Mix:

TREFLAN may be tank mixed with Eptam and applied as a preplant soil incorporated treatment to control additional weeds. This tank mix treatment must be incorporated immediately after application. Use incorporation instructions provided above.
