
The labeling cited above and submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended, is accepted subject to the comments listed on the enclosed sheet. A copy of your proposed labeling stamped "ACCEPTED WITH COMMENTS" is enclosed.

SERIOUS ERROR(S) ON SUBMITTED LABELING:

EPA has determined that one or more of the errors on the labeling you submitted to the Agency is categorized as "serious" as defined in PR Notice 93-11. In general, serious errors are those that may create a potential for harm to workers, handlers, other persons, or the environment; or those that prevent the achievement of the basic goals of the Worker Protection Standard (WPS) or FIFRA.

YOU MUST NOT SELL OR DISTRIBUTE (INCLUDING RELEASE FOR SHIPMENT) ANY PRODUCT BEARING THE SUBMITTED LABELING. Sale or distribution of any product with the incorrect labeling is a violation of FIFRA that could result in initiation of an action for civil penalties and/or cancellation of your product. In addition, the notification must include the following information, IF you have already sold or distributed any product bearing the submitted labeling:

- 1. Quantity of the product that has been sold or distributed.
- 2. EPA Producing Establishment number.
- 3. Location of the product, if known.
- 4. Proposed plan for assuring that product with the incorrect labeling in your control, as well as that in the hands of dealers/distributors/users, will be corrected. The plan must include your proposal for assuring that the labeling is corrected as soon as possible.

Failure to submit a notification also may result in initiation of an action under FIFRA for civil penalties, if you sold or distributed (this includes released for shipment) product bearing the incorrect labeling.

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IN ADDITION, YOU SHOULD CONTACT IMMEDIATELY THE PERSONS TO WHOM YOU SOLD OR DISTRIBUTED YOUR PRODUCT AND INFORM THEM NOT TO SELL OR DISTRIBUTE ANY PRODUCT WITH THE INCORRECT LABELING.

WHAT THIS ACCEPTANCE MEANS:

Rice (California Only)	Barnyardgrass (Watergrass) Sprangletop Smallflower Umbrellaplant	40 lbs.	Apply after flooding when rice is in the expanded two-leaf stage (first open leaf). Do not apply if rice exhibit symptoms of stress. The variety Cal Pearl may react adversely to some stress conditions more than other varieties. Barnyardgrass beyond the two-leaf stage and Smallflower Umbrellaplant beyond the three-leaf stage may not be controlled. Smallflower Umbrellaplant must be submerged for optimum control. Cold weather during the planting season may result in decreased weed control due to prolonged period of weed seed germination. Do not drain field for a minimum of four days after a BOLERO application. Water level in the checks should be maintained at 3 to 4 inches with no exposed soil. Water flow should be maintained at a minimum during and up to four days after application for good weed control. California may require special water management practices to minimize off-site water movement of BOLERO residues; consult your State Department of Food and Agriculture or County Agricultural Commissioner for further information. Precautions: Do not make more than one application per year. Do not plant subsequent crops in treated fields within 6 months of last application. Do not apply to rice paddies where commercial caffish or crayfish farming is practiced. Do not use adjacent to caffish ponds. Water drained directly from treated fields must not be used to irrigate other crops. SUGGESTED MANAGEMENT PRACTICES: Bolero 10 G use in rice fields which have received spring incorporation of high amounts (no straw burning or removal) of straw and/or green organic matter, may reduce plant stand and yield. Suggested management practices which will help promote woil conditions conducive for the production of healthy rice treated with BOLERO 10 G include: Burn crop residue where state regulations allow, or straw removal. Pall plowing/discing prior to final seed bed preparation. Uniform flood depth of 3-4*. Water-seeded rice fields treated with BOLERO 10 G post flood should be inspected regularly during tillering.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

PROHIBITIONS

Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage, disposal or cleaning of equipment. Open dumping is prohibited.
