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DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal Law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

INDUSTRIAL RECIRCULATING AND ONCE-THROUGH COOLING WATER SYSTEMS, and ORNAMENTAL FOUNTAINS:

Used effectively at dosages recommended to achieve exposures to one part per million (ppm) of 'active' residual bromine to control algal, bacterial and fungal diseases in industrial cooling towers; influent water systems, e.g. flow-through filters and lagoons, etc.; heat exchange water systems; industrial water scrubbing systems; brewery and canning pasteurizers and industrial air-washing systems equipped with a mist eliminator. Dosage rates:

Initial dose: When noticeably fouled, add 2-8 lbs. per 10,000 gallons of water contained in the system. Repeat initial dosage until at least one ppm of 'active' residual bromine is established for at least 4 hours.

Subsequent dose: When microbial control is evident, add 1-3 lbs. per 10,000 gallons of water contained in the system. Repeat as needed to maintain at least one ppm of 'active' residual bromine for at least 4 hours.

AIR CONDITIONER and EVAPORATIVE COOLER SYSTEMS:

Place tablets into condensate line dispenser or floatation device into the reservoir. Maintain 1-4 ppm 'active' bromine. Check once every month or more often as required. The life of the tablet(s) will vary depending upon atmospheric conditions and air temperature requirements. Do not place tablets directly onto metal surfaces.

PULP AND PAPER MILLS: This product is intended for use as a disinfectant for the process water used in the manufacture of paper and paperboard products. Do not exceed 2.2 lbs of this product per dry metric ton of fiber when this product is used in the manufacture of paper and paperboard products that contact food. Treat water at critical areas in the system process where mixing of the product with influent will be uniform. The frequency and duration of the treatment will depend upon the severity of the problem. Badly fouled systems must be cleaned before initial treatment. Use the initial treatment rate listed above under "Industrial Recirculating and Once-Through Systems", and adjust as necessary.

SWIMMING POOL SANITIZING: Ensure all pool equipment is working properly. Backwash the filter system following manufacturer's directions. Adjust pH to between 7.2-7.8. A bromine or chlorine residual of 1-2 ppm must first be established in the pool. If the residual is established with this product in a commercial bromine/chlorine feeder, use the feeder at the highest feed rate following manufacturer's directions. When bromine residual reaches 1-2 ppm, adjust the feeder accordingly. To maintain bromine residual, adjust the feeder to ensure a constant treatment level of 1-3 ppm in residential pools and 3-6 ppm in commercial pools. Test water regularly with a test kit or strips to ensure adequate residuals are present. Reentry into treated swimming pools is prohibited above levels of 8 ppm bromine.

SPAS AND HOT TUB SANITIZING: Ensure all spa equipment is working properly. Clean cartridge filter or backwash sand or DE filter system following manufacturer's directions. Adjust pH to between 7.2-7.8. Fill spa bromine feeder with this product and adjust feeder rate following manufacturer's directions to yield a bromine residual between 2-4 ppm in residential spas, and 4-6 ppm in commercial spas. Check feeder regularly and add additional product as needed to maintain bromine residual. The pump and filter should be operated for at least 3 hours daily whether spa is used or not. Do not heat water above spa manufacturer's recommendations. Keep spa free of leaves and other debris. To maintain sanitary conditions and ensure the performance of your spa chemicals, spas should be drained and refilled with fresh water every 30 days for residential spas and every 7 days for commercial spas. Reentry into treated spas is prohibited above levels of 8 ppm bromine.
