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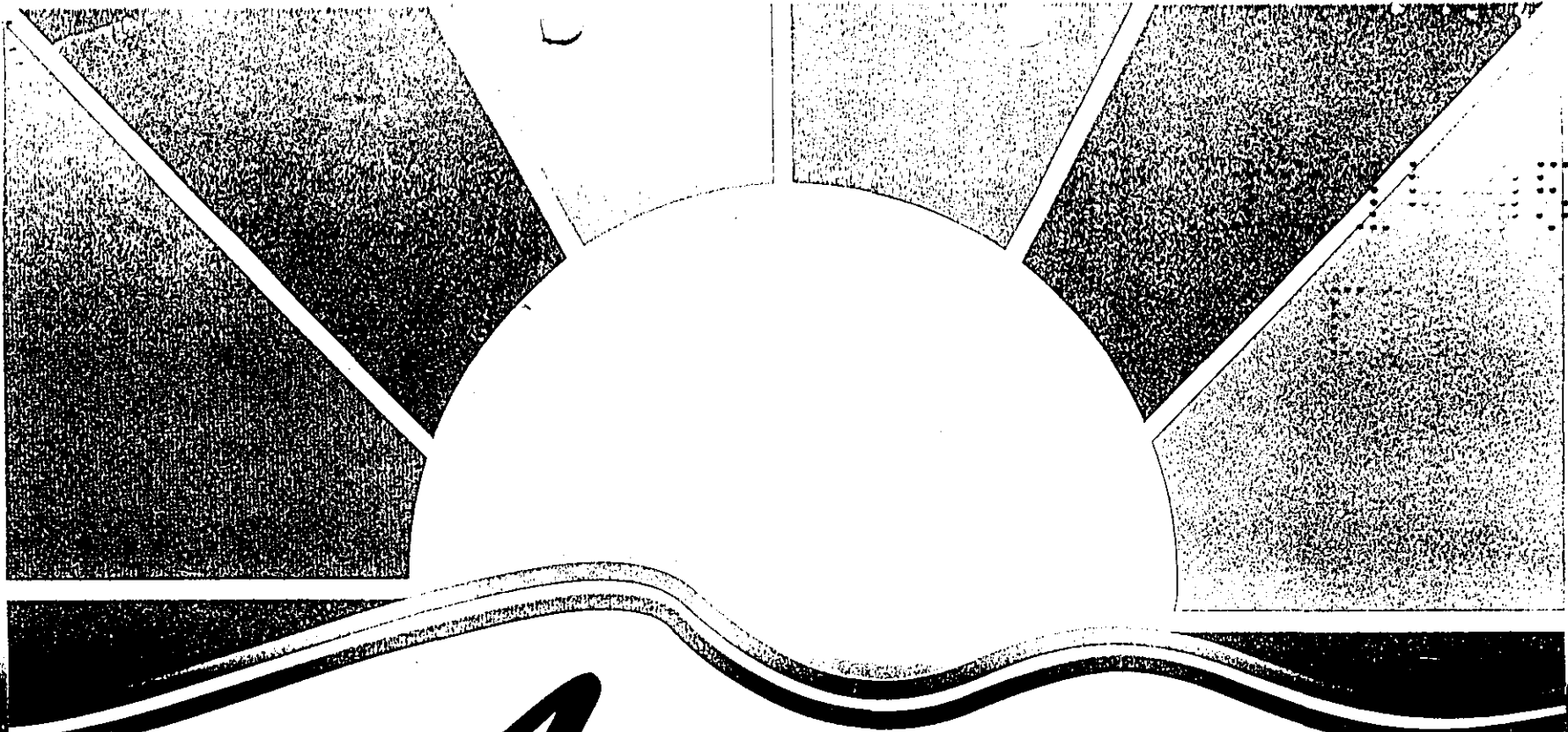

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS:

HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS

DANGER: Corrosive: Causes irreversible eye damage and skin burns. May be fatal if absorbed through the skin. May be fatal if inhaled. Do not breathe dust or spray mists. Irritation to nose and throat. Harmful if swallowed. Do not get into eyes, on skin, or on clothing. Wear goggles or face shield, protective clothing and rubber gloves when handling this product. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling and before eating, drink or using tobacco. Remove contaminated clothing and wash before use.

STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT (First Aid): IF SWALLOWED: Drink promptly large quantities of water. Do not induce vomiting. Avoid alcohol. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Call a physician or poison control center immediately. IF IN EYES: Hold eyelids open and flush with a steady, gentle stream of water for 15 minutes. Get medical attention. IF ON SKIN: Wash with plenty of soap and water. Get medical attention. IF INHALED: Remove victim to fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial respiration, preferably, mouth-to-mouth. Get medical attention.

NOTE TO PHYSICIAN: Probable mucosal damage may contraindicate the use of gastric lavage.

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARD: This pesticide is toxic to fish and aquatic organisms. Do not discharge effluent containing this product into lakes, streams, ponds, estuaries, oceans, or other waters unless in accordance with the requirements of a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit and the permitting authority has been notified in writing prior to discharge. Do not discharge effluent containing this product to sewer systems without previously notifying the local sewage treatment plant authority. STORAGE AND DISPOSAL: Do not contaminate by storage or disposal.

POOL START-UP: Fill the chlorinator with 20 tablets and adjust the feeder so that the chlorine residual is 5-10 ppm.

° These Act 90 tablets were manufactured for use in type feeders, where they are slowly dissolved as water flows over the tablets surface. If thrown away, Act 90 tablets may stain concrete or vinyl.

° 24 hours after filling the chlorinator, conduct a test kit for chlorine availability. If available, adjust the feeder so that the available chlorine is maintained between 1.0 to 2.0 ppm. The pH should be maintained between 7.2 and 7.6. Re-entry into treatment is prohibited above levels of 3 ppm of chlorine residual. Frequency of treatment, and dosage is dependent on bather load.
