It discourages geese from feeding on turf and emerging plants, pigeons from drinking and bathing in non-fish bearing bodies of water, pigeons, swallows, sparrows and wood peckers from roosting and nesting on or in structures.

Begin applications when crop begins to ripen or birds begin feeding. This product is more effective when applied in cool temperatures during early morning or late afternoon hours. Apply every 6 to 8 days or when odor cannot be detected. Repeat as necessary to maintain repellency. Harvest 6 to 8 days after last treatment or after all odor or taste of the product has dissipated (whichever occurs last). Do not apply this product to wet surfaces.
