Dear Ms. Andrasozky:

The above mentioned amendment submitted in connection with registration under FIFRA sec. 3(c)(7)(A) is conditionally accepted provided that you adhere to the following provisions.

1. Under "Precautionary Statements" "Can be" should be removed from the phrase "Can be fatal if swallowed...."
2. Under "Environmental Hazards" add "Do not contaminate water when disposing of equipment washwaters".
3. The word "POISON" should appear (in red) next to the signal word.

If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA sec. 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product constitutes acceptance of these conditions.

## PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS

### HAZARDS TO HUMANS (AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS) DANGER

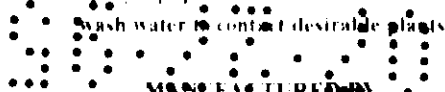

### STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

- If swallowed: Promptly drink a large quantity of milk, egg whites, gelatin solution, or if these are not available, drink large quantities of water. Avoid alcohol. Get medical attention. Note to physician: probable mucosal damage may contraindicate the use of gastric lavage.
- If inhaled: Remove victim to fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial artificial respiration, preferably mouth to mouth. Get medical attention.
- If on skin: Wash with plenty of soap and water. Get medical attention.
- If in eyes: Flush with plenty of water. Get medical attention.
