

APPLICATION: Apply Hot Pepper Wax Ready to Use as a foliar spray to the leaves, stems, fruits, and flowers of the plant until wet but not dripping. Good coverage of all portions of the plant will enhance repellency. Do not drench roots in soil or media.

Do not apply when rain is expected within 24 hours. During hot and humid weather, spray plants in the evening. Avoid use when plants are stressed by drought. Discontinue use if burning occurs.

FREQUENCY: For best results, keep new growth coated. In general, the repellency of Hot Pepper Wax is most effective on existing growth when applied every 7 to 14 days. However, more frequent application of up to every 3 days is appropriate when infestation is heavy. Use increased frequency only until pest numbers begin to decrease.

HOME GREENHOUSES: Repeated use of this product on sensitive plants has been reported to cause burning of leaves. Avoid use of this product if greenhouse temperature will exceed 85°F before the product has dried. For best results, ensure that spray contacts all foliage surfaces.

USES: Use Hot Pepper Wax Ready to Use to repel rabbits and tree squirrels from fruit and vegetable plants, indoor/outdoor ornamentals, and grasses. Avoid use on Variegated African Violets, Sweet Basil, Parsley, Dicentra exemia, and fruit trees when in the pink bud stage until after the petals fall. Hot Pepper Wax Ready to Use also is effective in repelling rabbits and tree squirrels from chewing on wooden structures and fences.

MIXING: Shake well before use.

APPLICATION: Apply Hot Pepper Wax Ready to Use as a foliar spray to the leaves, stems, fruits, and flowers of the plant until wet but not dripping. Good coverage of all portions of the plant is essential for repellency. Do not drench roots in soil or media.

Do not apply when rain is expected within 24 hours. During hot and humid weather, spray plants in the evening. Avoid use when plants are stressed by drought. Discontinue use if burning occurs.

Repeat application as soon as possible after any nibbling is observed. Once control is established, reapply every 3 to 4 weeks to previously sprayed surfaces.
