HOW TO USE CATTLE DUST

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

Dust livestock in the spring when horn flies first appear to prevent rapid increase in number of flies.

Directions:

Milk Cows - Sprinkle Cattle Dust over the shoulders and back. Rub dust lightly into the hair coat. Use one pound to 10 animals. Treat every 3 weeks, if necessary, for best hornfly control.

Calves and Heifers - Sprinkle Cattle Dust over shoulders, back and sides. Rub lightly into the hair coat. Use one pound to 15-30 animals, depending on size. Treat as often as necessary for best hornfly control, but no more frequently than once every 2 weeks.

Beef Cattle - Sprinkle Cattle Dust over shoulders, back and sides. Work thorough application into the hair coat. Treat as often as necessary for best hornfly control. Use at a rate of one pound per 10 animals and do not treat more frequently than once every 2 weeks.

CAUTION: Avoid contamination of feed and foodstuffs. Protect milk and milking equipment from contamination. Do not inhale.

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS

This pesticide is toxic to fish and aquatic invertebrates. Drift and runoff may be hazardous to aquatic organisms in neighboring areas. For terrestrial uses, do not apply directly to water, or to areas where surface water is present or to intertidal areas below the mean high water mark. Do not contaminate water when disposing of equipment washwaters.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage or disposal.

Storage: Store in a cool, dry area inaccessible to children.

Pesticide Disposal: Wastes resulting from the use of this product may be disposed of on site or at an approved waste disposal facility.

Container Disposal: Completely empty bag into application equipment. Then dispose of empty bag in a sanitary landfill or by incineration, or, if allowed by State and local authorities, by burning. If burned stay out of smoke.
