The labeling referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA) to comply with the Agency's revised May 28, 2008 "Risk Mitigation Decision (RMD) for Ten Rodenticides" as amended, will be acceptable provided you submit one (1) revised final printed copy with the following changes before releasing the product for shipment:

- 1. Revise "EPA. Reg. No.: 61517-27" to read "EPA Reg. No.: 67517-27" found at the bottom of the Master Label.
- 2. Revise the statement "For Use In and Around Agricultural Buildings and Industrial Sites Only", located on sublabel A, to read "This Product May Only be Used Inside and Within 50 Feet of Agricultural, Industrial, and Port or Terminal Buildings or Inside of Transport Vehicles (Ships, Trains, Aircraft)"
- 3. Add an "A" after "67517-27" on the lower left-hand side of all pages of sublabel A.
- 4. Add an "B" after "67517-27" on the lower left-hand side of all pages of sublabel B.
- 5. Revise the **PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS** as indicated:

CAUTION: Harmful if swallowed or absorbed through the skin. Keep away from children, domestic animals, and pets. Do not get in eyes, on skin, or on clothing. All handlers (including applicators) must wear shoes plus socks, and gloves. Any person who retrieves carcasses or unused bait following application of this product must wear gloves.

NOTICE: This product contains an ingredient known in the State of California to cause reproductive toxicity. Wash hands thoroughly after using this product. Dispose of as instructed below.

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User Safety Requirements

Follow manufacturer's instruction for cleaning/maintaining PPE. If no such instructions for washables, use detergent and hot water. Keep and wash PPE separately from other laundry. Remove PPE immediately after handling this product. Wash the outside of gloves before removing. As soon as possible, wash hands thoroughly after applying bait and before eating, drinking, chewing gum, using tobacco, or using the toilet and change into clean clothing.

TREATMENT FOR PET POISONING

If animal eats bait, call veterinarian or 1-800-xxx-xxxx [optional] at once.

NOTE TO PHYSICIAN OR VETERINARIAN

Contains the anticoagulant Warfarin. If swallowed, this material may reduce the clotting ability of the blood and cause bleeding. For humans or animals ingesting bait and/or showing poisoning signs (bleeding or elevated prothrombin times), give Vitamin K_1 orally or intramuscularly.

- 6. Revise the ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS section on sublabels A and B as follows: "This product is extremely toxic to mammals and birds. Dogs, cats, and scavenging mammals and birds might be poisoned if they feed upon animals that have eaten this bait. Do not apply directly to water, or to areas where surface water is present or to intertidal areas below the mean high water mark. Runoff may also be hazardous to aquatic organisms in water adjacent to treated areas. Do not contaminate water when disposing of equipment wash water or rinsate.
- 7. For sublabels A and B, add the following statement to the **READ THIS LABEL** section of the **DIRECTIONS FOR USE**: "Use only for the sites, pests, and application methods described on this label."
- 8. At the end of "IMPORTANT" and immediately before "USE SITES" add: "Note: Bait stations are mandatory for outdoor, above-ground use. Tamper-resistant bait stations must be used if children, pets, non-target mammals, or birds may access the bait."
- 9. Revise the **USE SITES** and **USE RESTRICTIONS** sections on sublabel A as follows: **USE SITES**: "This product may be used only to control Norway Rats, Roof Rats, and House Mice inside and outside within 50 feet of industrial and agricultural buildings, and similar man-made structures."

USE RESTRICTIONS: "Do not place near or inside ventilation duct openings. Do not place bait in areas where there is a possibility of contaminating food or surfaces that come into contact with food. Do not contaminate water, food, feedstuffs, food or feed handling equipment, or milk or meat handling equipment or surfaces that come into direct contact with food. Do not use this product in sewers. Do not broadcast bait. Do not apply further than 50 feet from buildings. Do not sell this product in individual containers holding less than 4 pounds of bait."

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10. Revise the **USE SITES** and **USE RESTRICTIONS** sections on sublabel B as follows: **USE SITES**: "This product may be used only to control Norway Rats, Roof Rats, and House Mice inside and outside within 50 feet of homes, industrial and agricultural buildings, and similar man-made structures."

USE RESTRICTIONS: "Do not place near or inside ventilation duct openings. Do not place bait in areas where there is a possibility of contaminating food or surfaces that come into contact with food. Do not contaminate water, food, feedstuffs, food or feed handling equipment, or milk or meat handling equipment or surfaces that come into direct contact with food. Do not use this product in sewers. Do not broadcast bait. Do not apply further than 50 feet from buildings. Do not sell this product in individual containers holding less than 4 pounds of bait."

- 11. Make the following revisions to the **SELECTION OF TREATMENT AREAS** section on sublabels A and B:
 - a. Revise the first sentence to read "Determine areas where rats and mice will most..."
 - b. Revise the second sentence to read "...or in locations where rats and mice or their signs have been seen."
- 12. Make the following revision to the APPLICATION DIRECTIONS section on sublabels A and B:
 - a. Revise "Individual rodents..." to read "Individual rats and mice."
 - b. Add "in infested areas" after "...packs per placement location." In the Norway and Roof Rats section and after "...8 to 12 foot intervals." in the House Mice section.
- 13. Make the following revisions to the Follow-Up section on sublabels A and B:
 - a. Replace "rodent" with "rat and mouse" where ever it is mentioned.
 - b. Replace "rodents" with "rats and mice" where ever it is mentioned.
 - c. Revise "Collect and..." to read "Wearing gloves, collect...dead rats and mice and leftover bait."
- 14. Revise the **CONTAINER DISPOSAL** statement to read:

CONTAINER HANDLING: Nonrefillable container. Do not reuse or refill this container. [Plastic:] Triple rinse (or equivalent), then offer for recycling or reconditioning; or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill; or by incineration. In most states, burning is not allowed. [Paper:] Dispose of empty container by placing in trash, at an approved waste disposal facility or by incineration. In most states, burning is not allowed.

- 15. As stated in 40CFR156.140(a)(4), a batch code must be included on the label or package for container and containment for nonrefillables.
- 16. Include "It is illegal to sell these placepacks individually" prominently on the front panel of your placepack label.

Should you wish to add a reference to the company's website on your label, please be aware that the website becomes labeling under the Federal Insecticide Fungicide and Rodenticide Act and is subject to review by the Agency. Terms/Conditions of Sale/Distribution

The registrant must not sell or distribute product in a manner that results in sale in stores oriented towards residential consumers (e.g. grocery, drug, hardware, home improvement stores). The registrant may sell or distribute the product in a manner that results in sale in stores oriented towards agricultural consumers: (i.e. farm, agricultural, tractor stores) and pest control operators.

This product may not be sold in packaging that holds less than 4 pounds of bait.

Existing Stocks Provisions

- The registrant may not distribute or sell existing stocks of this product after June 4, 2011 unless they conform to the terms and conditions of registration as amended today.
- Any person other than the registrant may sell and distribute existing stocks of this product with the previously approved label until such stocks are exhausted.
- Any person may use existing stocks of this product with the previously approved label until such stocks are exhausted.

If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA section 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product constitutes acceptance of these conditions.
