Mice: Apply 1/4 to 1/2 ounce (1-2 level teaspoons) of bait per placement, usually spaced 8 to 12 feet apart. Larger placements up to 2 ounces (56 grams) may be needed at points of very high House Mouse activity. Maintain a constant supply of fresh bait for 15 days or until signs of House Mouse activity ceases.

Follow-Up: Replace contaminated or spoiled bait immediately. Using waterproof gloves, collect and properly dispose of all visible dead animals and leftover bait. To discourage reinfestation, limit sources of rodent food, water, and harborage as much as possible. If reinfestation does occur, repeat treatment. For a continuous infestation, set up permanent bait stations and replenish bait as needed.
