Label

The labeling submitted with the above letters, under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA) is acceptable, provided you submit one (1) copy of final printed labeling to us, with the following changes, before you ship your product.

1. The correct headings for your "STORAGE AND DISPOSAL" text are as follows:

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

[Household Use:]

STORAGE: Store ... pets.

DISPOSAL: If Empty ... outdoor drain.

[Non-Household Use:] Do not ... or disposal.

STORAGE: Store ... chemicals.

PESTICIDE DISPOSAL: Wastes ... facility. CONTAINER DISPOSAL: Dispose ... smoke.

- 2. In the future, if you would like a "mouse only" label, submit three (3) copies of the proposed label, with all rat reference removed from the text and three (3) copies of the rat label.
- 3. As long as the product is sold in sizes that equal or exceed the maximum placement for rats, no qualifying statements are needed in the rat directions.

A copy of the stamped label for each product is enclosed for your records.

Existing stocks

Stocks of existing labels may be used for eighteen (18) months.

Consequence for non-compliance

If this condition is not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA section 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product constitutes acceptance of this condition.

This product is not an anticoagulant type of rodenticide. If ingested, limit absorption by either emesis or gastric lavage. Sublethal symptoms, if present, would be the result of cerebral edema and should be treated accordingly through administration of an osmotic diuretic and corticosteroid.

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS

This product is toxic to mammals and birds. Do not apply directly to water, or to areas where surface water is present or to intertidal areas below the mean high water mark. Dogs and other predatory and scavenging mammals might be poisoned if they feed upon animals that have eaten this bait.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal Law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

READ THIS LABEL: Read this entire label and follow all use directions and use precautions.

IMPORTANT: Do not expose children, pets or other nontarget animals to rodenticides. To help to prevent accidents:

- 1. Store product not in use in a location out of reach of children and pets.
- 2. Apply bait in locations out of the reach of children, pets, domestic animals and nontarget wildlife, or in tamper-resistant bait stations. These stations must be resistant to destruction by dogs and by children under six years of age, and must be used in a manner that prevents such children from reaching into bait compartments and obtaining bait. If bait can be shaken from stations when they are lifted, units must be secured or otherwise immobilized. Even stronger bait stations are needed in areas open to hoofed livestock, raccoons, bears, or other potentially destructive animals, or in areas prone to vandalism.
- 3. Dispose of product container and unused, spoiled and unconsumed bait as specified on this label.

USE RESTRICTIONS: For control of Norway rats, roof rats, and house mice inside and against outside walls of homes, industrial and agricultural buildings, and similar man-made structures. This product may also be used in alleys located in urban areas, inside transport vehicles (ships, trains, aircraft), and inside and against outside walls of related port or terminal buildings. Do not use this product in Sewers. For use in non-food/non-feed areas. Do not contaminate human or pet food preparations items or areas. Do not place near or inside ventilation duct openings. Do not broadcast bait.

SELECTION OF TREATMENT AREAS: Determine areas where rodents will most likely find and consume the bait. Generally, these are along walls, by gnawed openings, in or beside burrows, in corners and concealed places, between floors and walls, or in locations where rodents or their signs have been seen. Protect bait from rain or snow. Remove as much alternative food accessible to rodents as possible.

APPLICATION DIRECTIONS: The active ingredient in This product is different from anticoagulant rodenticides. Generally rodents cease feeding after consuming a lethal amount and die within a few days.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE (CONTINUED)

Norway and Roof Rats: Apply 1-8 cunces of bait per placement location. Space placements at intervals of 15 to 30 feet. For burrows baiting, use ASSAULT MOUSE/RAT PLACE PACKS. Use 1 or 2 cunces per burrow. When baiting burrows, insert each bait pack into the burrow far enough so that only a person who knows that bait is there would be likely to see it. Do not bait the burrows in any location accessible to children or non-target animals unless there is no other way to bait the target population effectively. If burrows in such an area are baited, check burrows every morning and evening to make sure that rodents have not pushed bait packs out of burrows and that bait have not become more accessible to children and non-target animals in any way. Remove packs that become more accessible to non-target animals. Remove the packages of bait from burrows if the bait has not been touched by target rodents for seven days. These packs may be relocated or properly disposed.

<u>House Mice:</u> Apply 1/2 ounce to 3 ounces of bait per placement. Space placements at intervals of 8 to 12 feet. Larger placements may be needed at points of extremely high mouse activity.

Baiting Strategy: Adjust the amount of bait applied to the level of feeding by target rodents expected at each placement location. Highest bait consumption is expected to occur during the first day or two after treatment. After several days, inspect bait placements and replenish bait at sites where there is heavy feeding or where there is continued evidence of rodent activity. Maintain bait for at least one week and continue baiting until all signs of rodent activity have ceased or its become clear that the remaining rodents are not attracted to the bait.

Collect and properly dispose of all dead rodents and leftover bait. To discourage reinfestation, limit sources of rodent food, water, and harborage as much as possible. If reinfestation does occur, repeat treatment. Where a continuous source of infestation is present, establish permanent bait stations and replenish as needed.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

HOUSEHOLD USE:

PESTICIDE STORAGE: Store only in original container in a cool, dry place inaccessible to children and pets.

CONTAINER DISPOSAL: If Empty: Do not reuse this container. Place in trash or offer for recycling if available. If partly filled: Call your local solid waste agency or 1-800-CLEANUP for disposal instructions. Never place any unused product down any indoor or outdoor drain.

NON-HOUSEHOLD USE:

Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal.
