
Revised Labeling submitted April 18, 1998

Dear Mr. Dyer,

Your submission of proposed revised labeling for EPA Reg. No. 67517-77, dated April 18, 1998, which included a revised label for the 1.5-oz. non-tamper-resistant bait station and a proposed new name for this product, has been reviewed. The proposed new product name, "Assault Mouse Killer Station," is acceptable. The revised label is acceptable provided that you modify the label as indicated below.

- 1. The expression "Safety Doors," which appears on the front panel, could be construed as a safety claim which would misbrand the product [see 40 CFR 156.10(a)(5)(ix and x)]. To remove this concern, either change "Safety Doors" to "Mouse Doors" or delete the entire front-panel reference to "Safety Doors." The reference to "Safety Doors" is made superfluous by the text of the third paragraph of the "APPLICATION DIRECTIONS:" subsection of the "DIRECTIONS FOR USE:".
- 2. When final labels are printed, retain the organizational format for the "DIRECTIONS FOR USE" that was used for the proposed label submitted April 18, 1998. As you claim there is no "outer package" and did not submit labeling for an "outer package" for this product, there may be no outer package (aside from a clear plastic wrap which does not obscure any label text) used when this product is displayed for retail sale.

In addition, from the proposed use directions for this product, it appears to us that the old "COUNT DOWN" bait station design still is to be used for this product. Please let us know immediately if this impression is not correct.



Please submit one copy of your revised final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment. If the above specified conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA section 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product bearing the amended labeling constitutes acceptance of these conditions.

USE RESTRICTIONS: For indoor use only. This product may be used to control house mice in homes, and industrial, commercial, and agricultural buildings. Do not use this product in sewers or any outdoor area. Do not place this ready-to-use bait station in any area where there is a possibility of contaminating food or surfaces that come into contact with food. Do not break station open and/or deliberately remove bait from it.

SELECTION OF TREATMENT AREAS: Determine indoor areas where rodents will most likely find and consume the bait. Generally, these are along walls, by gnawed openings, or beside burrows, in corners and concealed places, in walls, or floor voids, or in other locations where rodents or signs of rodents have been seen. Use only on dry surfaces. Remove as much alternative food as possible.

APPLICATION DIRECTIONS: ASSAULT MOUSE KILLER STATION does not contain an anticoagulant rodenticide. Generally, mice will consume a toxic dose in a single-night's feeding with death occurring two or more days later.

Place ASSAULT MOUSE KILLER STATION bait stations at 8- to 12-foot intervals in locations where this label permits this product to be used. Once stations are opened, mice may enter station and gnaw through thin plastic screening to obtain bait.

To make bait available to mice, insert a quarter into the slot in each white circular "doors" and turn counterclockwise for 1/4 turn, aligning the bumps on the doors with the arrows on the top of the station. Store the doors beside the mouse entrances by inserting the pegs on the backs of the doors through the small holes provided. Replace and "lock" doors in mouse entrances before moving or disposing of ASSAULT MOUSE KILLER STATION stations.

Highest bait consumption is expected to occur during the first day or two after treatment begins. After several days, inspect stations and replace those from which nearly all bait has been removed if there is continued evidence of mouse activity. Maintain baiting program for at least one week and continue until all signs of mouse activity have ceased or it becomes clear that the mice remaining are not attracted to the stations or the bait.

Collect and dispose properly of all dead mice and spilled bait. Dispose of used bait stations as indicated below in the "CONTAINER DISPOSAL" paragraph. To discourage reinfestation, limit sources of food, water, and harborage for mice. If reinfestation does occur, repeat treatment.
