The labeling, referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended, is acceptable provided that you:

1. Make the labeling changes listed below before you release the product for shipment bearing the amended labeling:
 - a. Under the subheading entitled "FOR CONTAINERS OF 5 GALLONS OR MORE," please delete the term "WARNING". Per the 3rd Edition of Label Review Manual(Ch. 7), the Agency does not approved labels containing the terms "caution," "warning" or "danger," except as the Signal Word for that label. Alternatively, you may use the term "notice" or "attention".
 - b. Include the following maximum application rates and frequency for 2,4-D on turf:

Maximum Application Rates: 2 lbs. ae per acre per application for turf.
Maximum Application Frequency: 2 broadcast applications per year per site for turf.
2. Please submit one (1) final printed copy of the referenced label, incorporating the above change, before releasing the product for shipment.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal Law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with labeling.

Do not allow people (other than applicator) or pets on treatment area during application. Do not enter treatment areas until spray has dried. When mixing, loading, or applying this product or repairing or cleaning equipment used with this product, wear eye protection (face shield or safety glasses), chemical resistant gloves, long sleeved shirt, long pants, socks and shoes. It is recommended that safety glasses include front, brow and temple protection. After using this product, rinse gloves before removing. Wash hands, face and arms with soap and water as soon as possible after mixing, loading or applying this product. Wash hands, face and arms with soap and water before eating, smoking or drinking. Wash hands and arms before using toilet. After work, remove all clothing and shower using soap and water. Do not reuse clothing worn during the previous day's mixing and loading or application of this product without cleaning first. Clothing must be kept and washed separately from other household laundry. Remove saturated clothing as soon as possible and shower.

FOR CONTAINERS OF 5 GALLONS OR MORE: A mechanical system (probe and pump) must be used for transferring the contents of this container. If the contents of a non-refillable pesticide container are emptied, the probe must be rinsed before removal.

WARNING: Do not use on lawns of creeping grasses, such as bent, St. Augustine, carpetgrass or Dichondra, except for spot spraying, nor on seeded turf until grass has become well established. Most legumes are usually damaged or killed. Do not allow spray mist to drift onto these or other broadleaf plants you are not trying to kill, since even minute quantities of spray may cause severe injury. Use low pressures when spraying to produce coarse sprays which are less likely to drift. Do not spray on windy days.

FOR TREATING SMALL AREAS: Two tablespoons in 1 1/2 gallons of water is almost equal to half a gallon in 100 gallons.

SPOT TREATMENT: For knapsack application of SE-LECT for spot treatment of such weeds as thistles, mix 1 cup of SE-LECT in 3 gallons of water. Wet all foliage thoroughly.

TURF WEED CONTROL: For lawns and other turf areas, use 2 quarts of SE-LECT per acre. Apply when foliage is growing rapidly in late spring or early summer.

GENERAL WEED CONTROL: In vacant lot, on roadsides and along fence rows, use enough spray to wet all foliage. 1 gallon of SE-LECT in 100 gallons of water will control most young weeds; however, 1 1/2 gallons may be necessary for more resistant weeds. Deep-rooted perennial weeds, such as bindweed and Canada thistle may require repeated applications as new growth appears. Application should be made when plants are growing actively in late spring or early summer, and foliage is fully expanded.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL
