Whirling Disease poses a devastating threat to wild trout fisheries. *Myxobolus Cerebalis*, the Whirling Disease parasite, has inflicted heavy damage to rainbow trout populations throughout the Rocky Mountains. Concerned anglers have focused on the Madison River, which has lost 90-95% of its wild rainbows between Quake Lake and Ennis. Sadly, the Madison is now joined by many other famous trout streams. The Yellowstone, Missouri, Colorado, Roaring Fork, Gunnison and Dolores Rivers are among the many which are now heavily infected with the deadly parasite.
