


3. Revise the Precautionary Statements to read as follows:



**ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS**

This pesticide is toxic to fish. Keep out of lakes, ponds or streams. Do not contaminate water by cleaning of equipment or disposal of wastes.

**STORAGE AND DISPOSAL**

Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage, disposal or cleaning of equipment.

**Storage.** Store in a cool, well-ventilated storage area. Temperatures in excess of 40 degrees centigrade will cause decomposition of IPBC. Store in original container only in a locked place out of reach of children. Protect from freezing.

**Pesticide Disposal.** Wastes resulting from the use of this product may be disposed of on site or at an approved waste disposal facility.

**Container Disposal.** Do not reuse empty container. Dispose of container in a sanitary landfill or by incineration, or if allowed by state and local authorities, by burning. If burned, stay out of smoke.

**Directions for Use**

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

**AGRICULTURAL USE**

Use this product only in accordance with its labeling and with the Worker Protection Standard, 40 CFR Part 170. This Standard contains requirements for the protection of agricultural workers on farms, forests, nurseries, and green houses and handlers of agricultural pesticides. It contains requirements for training, decontamination, notification and emergency assistance. Apply as a dip bath or coarse spray according to the below dilutions. For best protection, apply to recently felled and freshly sawn or peeled wood ensuring total coverage. Allow to drain in a contained area before storage.

- AVERAGE and WINTER conditions: Mix 1 gallon with 200-300 gallons of water.
- SEVERE and SUMMER conditions: Mix 1 gallon with 140-200 gallons of water.
- EXPORT TIMBER, ROUND PRODUCE and BORON BATH TREATMENT. Mix 1 gallon with 125-200 gallons of water.
