## **ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS**

## AGRICULTURAL USE REQUIREMENTS

## CHEMIGATION

Do not apply this product through any type of irrigation system.

**Spray Volume** 

TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE may be applied in 50 gallons or more of spray solution per acre by ground spray equipment or in 15 gallons or more per acre by aircraft equipment except as noted under "REMARKS" for each crop. Increase spray volume as crop growth increases to ensure thorough coverage of the foliage and fruit. Check equipment calibration frequently. Complete coverage and uniform application are essential for the most effective results, especially when lower spray volumes are applied.

Aerial application is prohibited in New York State.

#### Mixing

Add specified amount of TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE into the spray tank while filling with water to the desired level. Operate the agitator while mixing. If other materials are added to the spray tank, the TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE should be thoroughly dispersed prior to the addition of other materials.

#### **Ground Application Equipment**

The order of mixing is important and should be followed.

- 1. The spray tank should be filled 1/4 to 1/3 full of water.
- 2. While recirculating and with the agitator running, add the required amount of TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE, as determined under "Recommended Applications" into the spray tank as you continue filling the tank. Complete the filling

of the spray tank by adjung the amount of water to obtain the simum application rate of TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE (see APTLICATIONS Table). Depending on the water temperature and the degree of agitation, the product should be completely dissolved within a few minutes from the time added to the water. Cooler water temperatures increase the time needed for the TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE to dissolve completely. If an adjuvant is needed, add prior to addition of TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE to the spray tank.

- 3. The addition of other pesticides should be added before completely filling the tank.
- 4. As with any pesticide, maintain adequate agitation prior to and during spraying.

## **Aerial Application Equipment**

The mixing process should be made according to the same directions for ground application equipment.

## Compatibility

To determine the compatibility of TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE with other products, the following procedure should be followed:

Pour the recommended proportions of the products into a suitable container of water, mix thoroughly and allow to stand at least five (5) minutes. If the combination remains mixed or can be re-mixed readily, the mixture is considered physically compatible. For further information, contact your local Rotam representative.

## PRECAUTIONS:

OBSERVE THE FOLLOWING PRECAUTIONS WHEN SPRAYING IN THE VICINITY OF AQUATIC AREAS SUCH AS LAKES; RESERVOIRS; RIVERS; PERMANENT STREAMS, MARSHES OR NATURAL PONDS; ESTUARIES AND COMMERCIAL FISH FARM PONDS.

**Spray Drift management:** The interaction of many equipment and weather related factors determines the potential for spray drift. The applicator is responsible for considering all of these factors when making application decisions. Avoiding spray drift is the responsibility of the applicator.

**Buffer Zone Requirements:** For soil or foliar applications, do not apply by ground within 25 feet, or by air within 150 feet of lakes; reservoirs; rivers; permanent streams, marshes or natural ponds; estuaries and commercial fish farm ponds.

**Aerial Applications:** Mount the spray boom on the aircraft so as to minimize drift caused by wing tip vortices. The minimum practical boom length must be used, and must not exceed 75% of the wing span or rotor diameter.

**Importance of Droplet size:** An important factor influencing drift is droplet size. Small Droplet (<150 – 200 microns) drift to a greater extent than larger droplets. Within typical equipment specifications, applications must be made to deliver the largest droplet spectrum that provides sufficient control and coverage. Formation of very small droplets may be minimized by appropriate nozzle selection, by orientating nozzles away from the air stream as much as possible and by avoiding excessive spray boom pressure.

Spray must be released at the lowest possible height consistent with good pest control and flight safety. Applications more than 10 feet above the crop canopy must be avoided.

**Wind Speed Restrictions:** Drift potential increases at wind speeds of less than 3 mph (due to inversion potential) or more than 10 mph. However, many factors, including droplet size, canopy and equipment specifications determine drift potential at any given wind speed. Do not apply when winds are greater than 15 mph and avoid gusty and windless conditions. Risk of Exposure to sensitive aquatic areas can be reduced by avoiding applications when wind direction is toward the aquatic area.

Restrictions during Tempera Inversions: Do not make aerial or applications during temperature inversions. Drift potential is high during temperature inversions. Temperature inversions restrict vertical air mixing, which causes small suspended droplets to remail close to the ground and move laterally in a concentrated cloud. Temperature inversions are characterized by increasing temperature with altitude and are common nights with limited cloud cover and light to no wind. They begin to form as the sun sets and often continue into the morning. Their presence can be indicated by ground fog; however, if fog is not present, inversions can also be identified by the movement of smoke from a ground source. Smoke that layers and moves laterally in a concentrated cloud (under low wind conditions) indicates an inversion, while smoke that moves upward and rapidly dissipates indicates good vertical mixing.

Airblast (Air Assist) Requirements for Tree Crops and Vineyards: Airblast sprayers carry droplets into the canopy of trees/vines via a radially or laterally direction air stream. The following specific drift management practices should be followed:

- Adjust deflectors and aiming devices so that spray is only directed in the canopy;
- Block off upward pointed nozzles when there is no overhanging canopy;
- Use only enough air volume to penetrate the canopy and provide good coverage;
- Do not allow the spray to go beyond the edge of the cultivated area (i.e., turn off spray when turning at end rows);

Runoff Management: Do not cultivate within 10 feet of the aquatic areas to allow3 growth of a vegetative filter strip. When used on erodible soils, best management practices for minimizing runoff must be employed. Consult your local Soil conservation Service for common practices in your use area.

**Runoff Management:** Do not cultivate within 10 feet of the aquatic areas to allow growth of a vegetative filter strip. When used on erodible soils, best management practices for minimizing runoff should be employed. Consult your local Soil Conservation Service for recommendations in your use area.

#### **General Use Directions**

Apply specified dosage as a foliar spray in a minimum of 20 gallons or more of water per acre to assure thorough coverage of the plants. A spray oil recommended for use on banana or plantain should be utilized at 4.3 pints per acre in tank-mix with TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE. Thoroughly mix TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE in the spray solution prior to the addition of a spray oil. Make the first application before disease becomes established and repeat applications at 14-day intervals if necessary to maintain disease control.

Do not apply TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE to non-bagged bananas. A maximum of 16 ounces of TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE may be applied per acre per harvest cycle. TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE may be applied up to the day of harvest.

## **Powdery Mildew**

Apply in a preventive spray schedule. Make the first application of TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE before bloom and continue applications using spray intervals of up to 21 days in low to moderate disease pressure. Use a 14-day schedule when disease pressure is severe.

#### **Black Rot**

<u>Preventive Schedule:</u> Make the first application at 1- to 3-inches of new shoot growth and continue at 7- to 14-day intervals through 5° Brix stage or until veraison (berry coloring) is complete. Apply at 1-inch new shoot growth and at 7- to 10-day intervals on highly susceptible varieties or under severe disease conditions.

<u>Post-Infection Schedule:</u> A post-infection schedule may be followed from 1-inch new shoot growth through 5° Brix stage. Apply within 72 hours after the beginning of an infection period. TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE applications should not be closer than 7 days apart. Continue TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE applications using the preventive schedule if the post-infection schedule is discontinued.

## **Botrytis**

TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE, applied in a powdery mildew spray schedule, will enhance the activity of registered fungicides used for control of Botrytis bunch rot. Applications must be made on a 14-day schedule for suppression of Botrytis.

**GENERAL REMARKS:** TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE may be applied up to 14 days before harvest. A maximum of 2 pounds of TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE may be applied per acre per crop season. **The minimum interval between applications is 7 days.** 

Apply product in sufficient water for thorough coverage of vines and fruit. Increase spray volume as vine growth increases.

Restricted-entry Interval (REI): 12 hours

Begin applications when conditions are favorable for disease but before infection. Apply on a 7 to 14 day spray schedule.

A maximum of 32 ounces of product may be applied per acre per crop season. Do not cut cover crops in treated areas for feed, or allow livestock to graze treated areas. TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE may be applied up to 35 days before harvest.

Restricted-entry Interval (REI) = 12 hours.

Blossom blight: Begin application at pink bud. If the bloom period is extended, and/or severe disease conditions exist, make a second application at full bloom. If conditions remain favorable for disease, make another application at petal fall.

**GENERAL REMARKS:** Apply TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE in a minimum spray volume of 15 gallons per acre by air or 50 gallons per acre by ground. Reduce the application interval for varieties that are highly susceptible to the indicated diseases or when severe disease conditions exist. The use of ground application after petal fall is preferred because of difficulty in penetrating the canopy and obtaining thorough coverage of the foliage and fruit by air.

A maximum of 32 ounces of product may be applied per acre per crop season. Do not cut cover crops in treated areas for feed, or allow livestock to graze treated areas. TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE may be applied up to 35 days before harvest.

Restricted-entry Interval (REI) = 12 hours.

**RESISTANCE MANAGEMENT STRATEGY:** TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE is a sterol demethylation inhibitor (DMI) fungicide. It may be applied in a tankmix or alternated (every other spray application) with a non-DMI fungicide as a resistance management strategy. Do not Tank-mixing TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE with other DMI fungicides.

**Botryosphaeria:** Begin application at 25 to 50% bloom and repeat again 10 to 14 days later to protect young flower clusters and fruit. Make two additional applications of TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE 14 days apart beginning 49 days before harvest.

**GENERAL REMARKS:** Apply TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE in a minimum spray volume of 15 gallons per acre by air or 50 gallons per acre by ground. Reduce the application interval for varieties that are highly susceptible to the indicated diseases or when severe disease conditions exist. The use of ground application after petal fall is preferred because of difficulty in penetrating the canopy and obtaining thorough coverage of the foliage and fruit by air.

A maximum of 32 ounces of product may be applied per acre per crop season. Do not cut cover crops in treated areas for feed, or allow livestock to graze treated areas. TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE may be applied up to 35 days before harvest.

Control of insect vectors and a thorough pruning program to remove plant tissue infected by *Botryosphaeria* are critical for optimum control of this disease.

Restricted-entry Interval (REI) = 12 hours.

Filbert (Hazelnut) Eastern filbert blight 8 oz/acre

Apply TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE in a preventive spray schedule when conditions are favorable for disease (such as budbreak when the first green tissue is visible). Continue applications of TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE at 7 to 14-day intervals if weather conditions are conducive to disease development. Use shorter spray intervals during budbreak and rapid shoot elongation. The expanding shoot tip must be protected. Reduce the application interval for varieties that are highly susceptible to the indicated disease or when severe disease conditions exist.

Apply TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE in sufficient spray volume for thorough coverage. Tank mixing the lowest labeled rate of a spray surfactant with TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE may improve spray coverage and penetration of the active ingredient into plant tissue. The use of ground application is preferred because of the difficulty in penetrating the canopy and obtaining thorough coverage of the foliage and stems by air. A maximum of 32 ounces of TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE may be applied per acre per crop season. Do not cut cover crops in treated areas for feed, or allow livestock to graze treated areas. TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE may be applied up to 35 days before harvest.

## Scab:

**Preventative Schedule:** Apply at 7 to 10-day intervals from green tip through the second cover spray.

Post-Infection Schedule: Apply within 72 hours after the beginning of a scab infection period. TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE applications must not be closer than 7 days apart. Continue TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE applications using the preventative schedule if the post-infection schedule is discontinued.

**Cedar-apple rust:** Apply at 7 to 10-day intervals from pink stage through the second cover spray.

**Powdery mildew:** Apply at 7 to 10-day intervals from tight cluster through the second cover spray.

## **GENERAL REMARKS:**

\*The amount of TOLEDO 45WP AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE required per acre will depend on tree size and volume of foliage present. The rate per acre is based on a standard of 400 gallons of dilute spray solution per acre for large trees. **Wind Speed Restrictions:** Drift potential increases at wind speeds of less than 3 mph (due to inversion potential) or more than 10 mph. However, many factors, including droplet size, canopy and equipment specifications determine drift potential at any given wind speed. Do not apply when winds are greater than 15 mph and avoid gusty and windless conditions.
