2. Make the labeling changes listed below before you release the product for shipment:

"Not for use in food grade paper, paperboard and paper coating..."

- c. Add the following Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) language to the label:

Personal Protective Equipment

Applicators and other handlers must wear:

- coveralls over long-sleeved shirt and long pants,
- socks and chemical-resistant footwear,
- goggles or face shield, and
- chemical resistant gloves (such as barrier laminate or butyl nitrile/neoprene rubber, PVC, viton at ≥ 14 mils).

- d. Add the following subheading "**User Safety Requirements**" and text to the label:

"Follow manufacturers' instructions for cleaning/maintaining PPE. If no such instructions for washables, use detergent and hot water. Keep and wash PPE separately from other laundry."

- e. Add the following subheading "**User Safety Recommendations**" and text to the label:

User Safety Recommendations

"Users must wash hands before eating, drinking, chewing gum, using tobacco, or using the toilet. Users must remove clothing immediately if pesticide gets inside. Then wash thoroughly and put on clean clothing. Users must remove PPE immediately after handling this product. Wash the outside of gloves before removing. As soon as possible, wash thoroughly and change into clean clothing."

- f. The EPA establishment number must be listed on the label.

- g. All products are required to have appropriate storage instructions. Specific storage instructions are not prescribed by the Agency. You must develop storage instructions for your product. Refer to the label manual, chapter 13 and PR Notice 83-3 for detailed information.

3. Submit an updated Enforcement Analytical Method (GRN § 830.1800). See enclosed product chemistry review for detailed information.

4. Submit three (3) copies of the final printed label prior to releasing this product for sale.

If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA sec. 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product constitutes acceptance of these conditions.

A4 is a concentrate specifically designed to be used in a manufacturing facility where dosing and dusting can be controlled.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage and disposal. Open dumping is prohibited.

Pesticide Disposal
