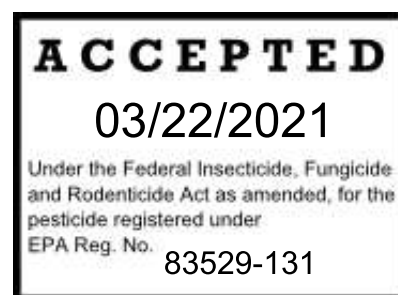

RESISTANCE MANAGEMENT

For resistance management, please note that **Sharda Bromacil 2% + Diuron 4% WDG** contains both a Group 5/[bromacil] and a Group 7/[diuron] herbicide. Any weed population may contain plants naturally resistant to Group 5 and Group 7 herbicides. The resistant individuals may dominate the weed population if these herbicides are used repeatedly in the same fields. Appropriate resistance-management strategies should be followed.

To delay herbicide resistance take one or more of the following steps:

- Rotate the use of **Sharda Bromacil 2% + Diuron 4% WDG** or other Group 5 and Group 7 herbicides within a growing season sequence or among growing seasons with different herbicide groups that control the same weeds in a field.
- Use tank mixtures with herbicides from a different group if such use is permitted; where information on resistance in target weed species is available, use the less resistance-prone partner at a rate that will control the target weed(s) equally as well as

the more resistance-prone partner. Consult your local extension service or certified crop advisor if you are unsure as to which active ingredient is currently less prone to resistance.

- Adopt an integrated weed-management program for herbicide use that includes scouting and uses historical information related to herbicide use and crop rotation, and that considers tillage (or other mechanical control methods), cultural (e.g., higher crop seeding rates; precision fertilizer application method and timing to favor the crop and not the weeds), biological (weed-competitive crops or varieties) and other management practices.
- Scout after herbicide application to monitor weed populations for early signs of resistance development. Indicators of possible herbicide resistance include:
 - (1) failure to control a weed species normally controlled by the herbicide at the dose applied, especially if control is achieved on adjacent weeds;
 - (2) a spreading patch of non-controlled plants of a particular weed species;
 - (3) surviving plants mixed with controlled individuals of the same species. If resistance is suspected, prevent weed seed production in the affected area by an alternative herbicide from a different group or by a mechanical method such as hoeing or tillage. Prevent movement of resistant weed seeds to other fields by cleaning harvesting and tillage equipment when moving between fields, and planting clean seed.
- If a weed pest population continues to progress after treatment with this product, discontinue use of this product, and switch to another management strategy or herbicide with a different mode of action, if available.
- Contact your local extension specialist or certified crop advisors for additional pesticide resistance-management and/or integrated weed-management recommendations for specific crops and weed biotypes.

MANDATORY SPRAY DRIFT MANAGEMENT

Ground Boom Applications:

- User must only apply with nozzle height recommended by the manufacturer, but no more than 4 feet above the ground or target vegetation.
- Applicators are required to use Coarse or coarser droplet size (ASABE S572.1).
- **DO NOT** apply when wind speeds exceed 10 miles per hour at the application site.
- **DO NOT** apply during temperature inversions.

Boomless Ground Applications:

- Applicators are required to use a Coarse or coarser droplet size (ASABE S572.1) for all applications.
- **DO NOT** apply when wind speeds exceed 10 miles per hour at the application site.
- **DO NOT** apply during temperature inversions.

SPRAY DRIFT ADVISORIES

THE APPLICATOR IS RESPONSIBLE FOR AVOIDING OFF-SITE SPRAY DRIFT. BE AWARE OF NEARBY NON-TARGET SITES AND ENVIRONMENTAL CONDITIONS.

Boom-less Ground Applications:

Setting nozzles at the lowest effective height will help to reduce the potential for spray drift.

IMPORTANCE OF DROPLET SIZE

An effective way to reduce spray drift is to apply large droplets. Use the largest droplets that provide target pest control. While applying larger droplets will reduce spray drift, the potential for drift will be greater if applications are made improperly or under unfavorable environmental conditions.

Controlling Droplet Size – Ground Boom

- Volume – Increasing the spray volume so that larger droplets are produced will reduce spray drift. Use the highest practical spray volume for the application. If a great spray volume is needed, consider using a nozzle with a higher flow rate.
- Pressure – Use the lowest spray pressure recommended for the nozzle to produce the target spray volume and droplet size.
- Spray Nozzle – Use a spray nozzle that is designed for the intended application. Consider using nozzles designed to reduce drift.

BOOM HEIGHT – Ground Boom

For ground equipment, the boom should remain level with the crop and have minimal bounce.

SHEILDED SPRAYERS

Shielding the boom or individual nozzles can reduce spray drift. Consider using shielded sprayers. Verify that the shields are not interfering with the uniform deposition of the spray on the target area.

TEMPERATURE AND HUMIDITY

When making applications in hot and dry conditions, use larger droplets to reduce effects of evaporation.

TEMPERATURE INVERSIONS

Drift potential is high during a temperature inversion. Temperature inversions are characterized by increasing temperature with altitude and are common on nights with limited cloud cover and light to no wind. The presence of an inversion can be indicated by

ground fog or by the movement of smoke from a ground source or an aircraft smoke generator. Smoke that layers and moves laterally in a concentrate cloud (under low wind conditions) indicates an inversion, while smoke that moves upward and rapidly dissipates indicates good vertical air mixing. Avoid applications during temperature inversions.

WIND

Drift potential generally increases with wind speed. AVOID APPLICATIONS DURING GUSTY WIND CONDITIONS.

PRODUCT INFORMATION

Non-Crop Weed Control - Industrial Use Only

Sharda Bromacil 2% + Diuron 4% WDG is a non-selective herbicide for controlling a wide range of annual and perennial weeds and grasses. It is advised only for non-cropland areas including rights-of-way for pipeline, utility, highway, and railroad; and industrial areas including airports, petroleum tank farms, lumberyards, and plant sites. 100 - 200 lbs. (2 lbs. bromacil - 4 lbs. diuron) applications of this product per acre usually result in a nonproductive condition of the soil for a period of a year or more. The duration of non-productivity is dependent upon rainfall, soil type, and other conditions.

Sharda Bromacil 2% + Diuron 4% WDG must be applied as furnished with a seed spreader, a fertilizer spreader, or a shaker-type applicator which will distribute the chemical uniformly over the areas to be treated. For the control of annual and most perennial weeds and grasses, apply **Sharda Bromacil 2% + Diuron 4% WDG** at the rate of 200 - 291 lbs. (4 lbs. bromacil and 8 lbs. diuron – 5.8 lbs. bromacil and 11.6 lbs. diuron) per acre; on smaller plots, 0.5 - 0.7 lb. (0.01 lb. bromacil and 0.02 lb. diuron – 0.014 lb. bromacil and 0.028 lb. diuron) of **Sharda Bromacil 2% + Diuron 4% WDG** per 100 square feet. Repeat spot treatment may be required when deep-rooted perennial weeds are present. To obtain best results, this product must be applied to the ground where it will be absorbed by the roots. Applications made early in the season have been found to give results superior to applications at a later seasonal date. This product may, however, be applied at any time of the year. Maximum effectiveness in arid regions is obtained when application is made just prior to the rainy season. Users must consult State Agricultural Experimental Stations or Extension Service weed specialists for suggestions as to use in their particular area.

Use Restrictions - :

- **DO NOT** apply this product in a way that will contact workers or other persons, either directly or through drift. Only protected handlers may be in the area during application.
- **DO NOT** enter or allow others to enter the treated area until dusts have settled.
- **(Not for Residential Use) DO NOT** apply on or near valuable woody or herbaceous plants or on areas where their roots may extend because of possible injury to such plants. Thoroughly clean spreading equipment with a suitable chemical cleaner before using for other purposes (or **DO NOT** use same spreading equipment for other purposes).
- **DO NOT** use on croplands or any land to be used for subsequent cropping. Keep animals off treated areas.
- Total application of this product must not exceed 291 pounds of product per acre per year (5.8 lbs. of bromacil and 11.6 lbs. of diuron per acre per year).
- **DO NOT** apply more than 291 lbs. (5.8 lbs. of bromacil and 11.6 lbs. of diuron per acre per year) of Sharda Bromacil 2% + Diuron 4% WDG in a single application.
- Application with a spoon, a pump-feed backpack spreader or a gravity-feed backpack spreader is prohibited.
- **DO NOT** apply more than 12 lbs. a.i. per acre in areas of high rainfall or dense vegetation.
- **DO NOT** apply more than 8 lbs. a.i. per acre in all other areas.
- **DO NOT** apply more than 2 applications per year when using reduced application rates.
- Minimum treatment interval: 90 days

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

DO NOT contaminate water, foodstuffs, feed, or seed by storage or disposal.

Triple rinse as follows: Empty the remaining contents into application equipment or a mix tank and drain for 10 seconds after the flow begins to drip. Fill the container ¼ full with water and recap. Shake for 10 seconds. Pour rinsate into application equipment or a mix tank or store rinsate for later use or disposal. Drain for 10 seconds after the flow begins to drip. Repeat this procedure two more times. Pressure rinse as follows: Empty the remaining contents into application equipment or a mix tank and continue to drain for 10 seconds after the flow begins to drip. Hold container upside down over application equipment or mix tank or collect rinsate for later use or disposal. Insert pressure rinsing nozzle in the side of the container, and rinse at about 40 PSI for at least 30 seconds. Drain for 10 seconds after the flow begins to drip. Then offer for recycling, if available, or reconditioning, if appropriate, or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill, or by incineration, or by other procedures approved by State and local authorities.

[Nonrefillable Container (greater than 50 pounds):] Nonrefillable container. **DO NOT** reuse or refill this container. Triple rinse container (or equivalent) promptly after emptying. Triple rinse as follows: Empty the remaining contents into application equipment or a mix tank. Fill the container ¼ full with water. Replace and tighten closures. Tip container on its side and roll it back and forth,

ensuring at least one complete revolution, for 30 seconds. Stand the container on its end and tip it back and forth several times. Turn the container over onto its other end and tip it back and forth several times. Empty the rinsate into application equipment or a mix tank or store rinsate for later use or disposal. Repeat this procedure two more times. Pressure rinse as follows: Empty the remaining contents into application equipment or mix tank and continue to drain for 10 seconds after the flow begins to drip. Hold container upside down over application equipment or mix tank, or collect rinsate for later use or disposal. Insert pressure rinsing nozzle in the side of the container and rinse at about 40 PSI for at least 30 seconds. Drain for 10 seconds after the flow begins to drip. Then offer for recycling, if available, or reconditioning, if appropriate, or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill, or by incineration, or by other procedures approved by State and local authorities.
