Dear Ms. Smith:

The amended labeling referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended, is acceptable.

The primary brand name of this product has been changed from "Bull Run Yellowjacket Attractant Cartridge" to "Bull Run Yellowjacket Trap Cartridge." Additionally, the alternate brand names "10-Week Yellowjacket Trap Cartridge" and "10-Week Yellowjacket Attractant Cartridge" have been added to the registration, and our records have been updated accordingly. This approval does not affect any terms or conditions that were previously imposed on this registration. You continue to be subject to existing terms or conditions on your registration and any deadlines connected with them.

A stamped copy of your labeling is enclosed for your records. This labeling supersedes all previously accepted labeling. You must submit one (1) copy of the final printed labeling before you release this product for shipment with the new labeling. In accordance with 40 CFR § 152.130(c), you may distribute or sell this product under the previously approved labeling for 18 months from the date of this letter. After 18 months, you may only distribute or sell this product if it bears this new revised labeling or subsequently approved labeling. "To distribute or sell" is defined under FIFRA section 2(gg) and its implementing regulation at 40 CFR § 152.3.

Should you wish to add/retain a reference to your company's website on your label, then please be aware that the website becomes labeling under FIFRA and is subject to review by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). If the website is false or misleading, the product will be

considered to be misbranded and sale or distribution of the product is unlawful under FIFRA section 12(a)(1)(E). 40 CFR § 156.10(a)(5) lists examples of statements the EPA may consider false or misleading. Therefore, should the EPA find or if it is brought to our attention that a website contains false or misleading statements or claims substantially differing from the EPA-approved registration, the website will be referred to the EPA's Office of Enforcement and Compliance Assurance.

Your release for shipment of this product constitutes acceptance of these terms. If these terms are not complied with, this registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA section 6.

#### **DIRECTIONS FOR USE**

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

- 1. Remove bottom cap of trap.
- 2. Cut and remove wrapper surrounding attractant cartridge.
- 3. Insert cartridge, vented end up, into center receptacle of bottom cap.
- 4. Reassemble and hang trap.
- 5. Wash hands with soap and water.

**Use Rate:** Use 2-4 traps for a 10,000 square foot area or 8 to 16 traps per acre. For areas with heavy infestation, use a maximum of 48 traps per acre.

**CAUTION:** Due to the extreme effectiveness of the attractant, use caution when placing and maintaining traps. Place and maintain traps in late evening or early morning when yellowjackets are less active. People allergic to yellowjacket stings should allow others to place and maintain traps for them. Yellowjacket stings can be fatal.

#### STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal.

**STORAGE:** Store in a cool, dry, well-ventilated location out of reach of children and pets.

**DISPOSAL:** Deposit in trash for collection. Wash hands with soap and water.
