Use for the formulation of:

Antifoulant Paints. Do not use for formulating antifoulant end use paints intended for application by residential (non-commercial) users involving airless spray or applications in closed or partially closed environments such as garages and tarped enclosures, etc. Paints formulated for residential applications using this product must be limited to an amount, number of applications and frequency of applications that do not exceed applicator risk assessments as currently determined by the Environmental Protection Agency.

[For containers less than 50 lbs] Triple rinse as follows: Empty remaining contents into application equipment or a mix tank and drain for 10 seconds after the flow begins to drip. Fill the container ¼ full with water and recap. Shake for 10 seconds. Pour rinsate into application equipment or a mix tank or store rinsate for later use or disposal. Drain for 10 seconds after the flow begins to drip. Repeat this procedure two more times.

[For containers greater than or equal to 50 lbs] Triple rinse as follows: Empty remaining contents into application equipment or a mix tank. Fill the container 1/4 full with water. Replace and tighten closures. Tip container on its side and roll it back and forth, ensuring at least one complete revolution, for 30 seconds. Stand the container on its end and tip it back and forth several times. Turn the container over onto its other end and tip it back and forth several times. Empty the rinsate into application equipment or a mix tank or store rinsate for later use or disposal. Repeat this procedure two more times.
