The Agency, in accordance with the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended, has completed reviewing all the information submitted with your application to support the Registration Review of the above referenced product in connection with the Pyriproxyfen Interim Decision, and has concluded that your submission is acceptable. The label referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under FIFRA, as amended, is acceptable.

Should you wish to add/retain a reference to the company's website on your label, then please be aware that the website becomes labeling under the Federal Insecticide Fungicide and Rodenticide Act and is subject to review by the Agency. RESISTANCE MANAGEMENT RECOMMENDATIONS

For resistance-management, **Avalaire Pyriprox 0.5 FAB** contains a Group 7 insecticide. Any insect population may contain individuals naturally resistant to **Avalaire Pyriprox 0.5 FAB** and other Group 7 insecticides. The resistant individuals may dominate the insect population if this group of insecticides are used repeatedly in the same fields. Appropriate resistance management strategies should be followed.

To delay insecticide resistance, take the following steps:

- Rotate the use of **Avalaire Pyriprox 0.5 FAB** or other Group 7 insecticides within a growing season, or among growing seasons, with different groups that control the same pests. Avoid application of more than the maximum seasonal use rate or the total number of consecutive sprays of **Avalaire Pyriprox 0.5 FAB** per season.
- Use tank mixtures with insecticides from a different group that are equally effective on the target pest when such use is permitted. Do not rely on the same mixture repeatedly for the same pest population. Consider any known cross-resistance issues (for the targeted pests) between the individual components of a mixture. In addition, consider the following recommendations provided by the Insecticide Resistance Action Committee (IRAC):
 - o Individual insecticides selected for use in mixtures should be highly effective and be applied at the rates at which they are individually registered for use against the target species.
 - o Mixtures with components having the same IRAC mode of action classification are not recommended for insect resistance management.
 - o When using mixtures, consider any known cross-resistance issues between the individual components for the targeted pest(s).
 - o Mixtures become less effective if resistance is already developing to one or both active ingredients, but they may still provide pest management benefits.
 - o The insect resistance management benefits of an insecticide mixture are greatest if the two components have similar periods of residual insecticidal activity. PRODUCT INFORMATION

Do not apply this product through any type of irrigation system.

Avalaire Pyriprox 0.5 FAB is an Insect Growth Regulator similar to naturally occurring insect growth hormones which interfere with (stops) their growth or development. **Avalaire Pyriprox 0.5 FAB** breaks the reproductive life cycle of the ants, causing starvation of the colony. **Avalaire Pyriprox 0.5 FAB** is a slow acting, highly effective ant control product. Worker ants pick up the bait granules and take them back to the colony. Workers feed the bait to both the ant queen and the immature ants thereby preventing worker replacement. Due to degeneration of reproductive organs, the queen cannot replace workers. The lack of worker ant replacement results in colony death as the existing

worker ants age and die. Within 3 to 4 weeks there is substantial colony mortality and within 8 weeks the majority of the colony population has been eliminated.
