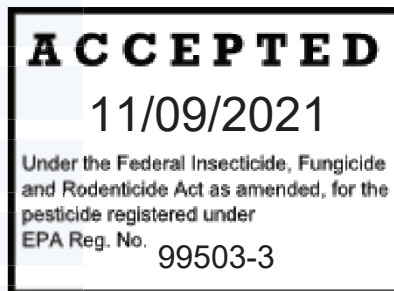

FIRST AID

DIRECTIONS FOR USE
