In accordance with 40 CFR § 152.130(c), you may distribute or sell this product under the previously approved labeling for 18 months from the date of this letter. After 18 months, you may only distribute or sell this product if it bears this new revised labeling or subsequently approved labeling. "To distribute or sell" is defined under FIFRA section 2(gg) and its implementing regulation at 40 CFR § 152.3.

Should you wish to add/retain a reference to your company's website on your label, then please be aware that the website becomes labeling under FIFRA and is subject to review by EPA. If the website is false or misleading, the product will be considered to be misbranded and sale or distribution of the product is unlawful under FIFRA section 12(a)(1)(E). 40 CFR § 156.10(a)(5) lists examples of statements the EPA may consider false or misleading. In addition, regardless of whether a website is referenced on your product's label, claims made on the website may not substantially differ from those claims approved through the registration process. PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS

Hazards to Humans and Domestic Animals:

DANGER. Corrosive. Causes irreversible and eye damage and skin burns. Fatal if absorbed through skin. Harmful if swallowed. Do not get in eyes on skin or clothing. May be fatal if inhaled. Avoid breathing dust or fumes. Wear protective eyewear (goggles and face shield). Wear chemically resistant coverall (or apron) over long sleeved shirt and long pants, socks, shoes and chemically resistant gloves (Butyl and Nitrile) when handling this product. Avoid contact with skin and clothing. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling and before eating, drinking, chewing gum, using tobacco or using the toilet. Remove and wash contaminated clothing before reuse.

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS: This pesticide is toxic to fish and aquatic organisms. Do not discharge effluent containing this product into lakes, streams, ponds, estuaries, oceans or other waters unless in accordance with the requirements of a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit and the permitting authority has been notified in writing prior to discharge. Do not discharge effluent containing this product to sewer systems without previously notifying the local sewage treatment plant authority. For guidance, contact your State Water Board or Regional Office of the EPA.

To protect the environment, do not allow pesticide to enter or run off into storm drains, drainage ditches, gutters or surface waters. Applying this product in calm weather when rain is not predicted for the next 24 hours will help to ensure that wind or rain does not blow or wash pesticide off the treatment area. Sweeping any product that lands on a driveway, sidewalk, or street, back onto the treated area of the lawn or garden will help to prevent run off to water bodies or drainage systems.

PHYSICAL OR CHEMICAL HAZARD: Oxidizing Material. Avoid contact with combustible materials. Keep away from all sources of heat, flame, or sparks. At elevated temperatures (above about 325° F) a self propagating thermal decomposition may occur with resultant irritating and toxic gases. In case of fire, flood with large quantity of water. In the event of contamination or decomposition, do not reseal container.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

Each repacker or reformulator must obtain their own registration from the Environmental Protection Agency to market their product.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage, disposal or cleaning of equipment.

PESTICIDE STORAGE: Retie polyethylene liner after each use and keep container tightly closed. Store in a dry place. Do not allow water to get into container. Keep container off wet floors. In case of spillage, please refer Pesticide Disposal instructions.

PESTICIDE DISPOSAL: Pesticide wastes are acutely hazardous. Improper disposal of excess pesticide, spray mixture or rinsate is a violation of Federal law.
