West Virginia Area Designations Under the October 2006 PM_{2.5} Standard

Dear Administrator Welsh:

On behalf of the State of West Virginia, I am herein making preliminary recommendations for areas to be designated under the federal October 2006 PM_{2.5} standard (35 ug/m³). This action is taken in accordance with your June 15, 2007 letter to Governor Joe Manchin III. As you are aware, we are still engaged in litigation concerning the 1997 PM_{2.5} annual standard area designations which EPA finalized in April 2005. Therefore, our initial recommendations are based primarily on Metropolitan Statistical Area boundaries and certified air monitoring values for the period 2004-2006 rather than the nine factors suggested in EPA's June 2007 guidance.
