On behalf of the Governor of the State of Idaho, and as Director of Idaho Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ), I am submitting Idaho's recommendations for area designations related to the December 14, 2012 revised Particulate Matter of 2.5 microns (PM_{2.5}) National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS).

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) strengthened the annual health-based $PM_{2.5}$ NAAQS by lowering the annual mean, averaged over 3-years, from $15\mu g/m^3$ to $12\mu g/m^3$. According to the January 15, 2013 Federal Register (78 FR 3086), attainment designations should be based on air quality data from the years 2010 to 2012.

The table below shows the three year average design values based on monitoring data with and without several days' data, flagged as "exceptional events" (EE) for Salmon and Pinehurst caused by 2012 wildfires. On December 6, 2013 DEQ submitted documentation for those exceptional events and requested EPA's concurrence on removing them from Idaho's design value calculation. Based on that concurrence, Idaho's two highest annual average $PM_{2.5}$ design values are $11.6\mu g/m^3$ in Salmon and $12.0\mu g/m^3$ in Pinehurst.
