

Dear Administrator Curt Spaulding,

Thank you for protecting New Hampshire's waters from dirty coal polluters like Public Service of New Hampshire's Merrimack Station coal plant in Bow, NH. It has been destroying the fish and other living creatures in the Merrimack River for many decades by withdrawing up to 287 million gallons of water from the river every day killing billions of fish and polluting the water. The Merrimack River provides drinking water for communities throughout New Hampshire and Massachusetts. I support your New Draft National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit for the Merrimack Station coal-fired power plant in Bow, New Hampshire since the permit would reduce the amount of water the coal plant uses by 95% and protect our river and wildlife. It is past time they installed modern, efficient technologies to reduce water use and stop killing so many fish.
