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DEFICIENCIES

After inspecting the areas shown in Section C of the attached Water Compliance Report Form, Kendall Perkins noted the following deficiencies:

Records/Reports

RECEIVED

1 – PSNH-MS did not explain a December pH violation in accordance of the NPDES reporting requirements. Specifically, PSNH-MS did not provide information about steps taken or planned to reduce, eliminate, and prevent reoccurance of the violation STER SUFFICIENT

As per Part II, Section D. 1. of the Permit, all instances of noncompliance shall be reported, and the reports shall contain a description of the noncompliance and its cause; the period of noncompliance, including exact dates and times, and if the noncompliance has not been corrected, the anticipated time the noncompliance is expected to continue; and steps taken or planned to reduce, eliminate, and prevent reoccurrence of the noncompliance.

DES believes that Public Service of New Hampshire can correct this deficiency by August 1, 2000 and requests that you respond by this date detailing the corrective measures. Please send the written response to DES/WD-WWEB, Attention: Kendall Perkins, P.O. Box 95, Concord, NH 03302-0095. In the event that DES does not receive a response by the above date, DES or EPA may initiate further State and/or Federal action. Further action may include issuing an administrative order, initiating an administrative fine proceeding and/or seeking civil or criminal penalties.
