Granite Shore Power Completes Acquisition of Select Power Generating Assets of Public Service Company of New Hampshire

Concord, NH – January 10, 2018 – Granite Shore Power LLC, a joint venture of Castleton Commodities International LLC (CCI) and Atlas Holdings LLC, announced today that it had completed its acquisition of select generating assets of Public Service Company of New Hampshire (PSNH) d/b/a Eversource Energy. Granite Shore Power will now own Merrimack Station in Bow, Newington Station in Newington, Schiller Station in Portsmouth as well as combustion turbines in Groveton and Tamworth.

“We’re very pleased to acquire the Newington, Merrimack, Schiller, Lost Nation, and White Lake facilities,” said Jim Andrews, President of Granite Shore Power and its subsidiaries. “We look forward to not only ensuring a smooth transition of ownership but to having these facilities continue to serve as reliable and cost-efficient sources of power. In the months ahead, we intend to establish strong partnerships with our associates, the communities in which we operate, and those served by these facilities.”
