Hi Linda –

Thank you for your letter of November 10, 2017, regarding transfer of the NPDES permits for Merrimack Station, Schiller Station, and Newington Station (collectively, "the Facilities") to the future new owners of the facilities. I wanted to follow up with you regarding the request for an "automatic transfer" of the permits.

I think you have correctly pointed to 40 C.F.R. § 122.61(b) as specifying the conditions under which an automatic transfer of an NPDES permit can take place. The pre-conditions for an automatic transfer include that the current permittee notifies the permitting agency at least 30 days prior to the proposed date for the transfer of permit responsibility, *see* 40 C.F.R. § 122.61(b)(1), and that the notification "includes a written agreement between the existing and new permittees containing a specific date for transfer of permit responsibility, coverage, and liability between them ..." 40 C.F.R. § 122.61(b)(2). Your letter indicates that closing on the transfer of ownership of the Facilities is likely to occur by the end of December 2017 and that you will inform us of the specific date when it becomes known to you. Please do be sure to provide notice of the exact date as soon as it is known to you.

In addition, in order to satisfy the requirement of 40 C.F.R. § 122.61(b)(2) regarding provision of "a written agreement between the existing and new permittees containing a specific date for transfer of permit responsibility, coverage, and liability between them," your letter provided a link to the Purchase and Sale Agreement (PSA) governing the sale of the Facilities to the new owners. You indicate that the PSA "explains and allocates permit responsibility, coverage, and liability between PSNH and Granite Shore during and upon completion of the divestiture process." I have reviewed the PSA and have a couple of follow-up questions concerning the allocation of permit responsibility. I have not spotted any problems at this time. I just want to make sure that I understand the terms of the agreement that are relevant to this issue.

Therefore, I am proposing that we have a conference call at your earliest convenience. I suspect 30 minutes would suffice, but perhaps we can schedule it for an hour just in case.

Please let me know if a conference call makes sense to you and propose some times that might work for you all.
