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Thank you for speedy replies.

Allan Palmer initially indicated this meeting was to be an opportunity for PSNH, Normandeau and Enercon to review the data/reports that PSNH had submitted to Region 1 in the last several years. PSNH wanted to ensure EPA had no questions concerning the volumes of data and observations that were submitted.

Apparently a PSNH Vice President has taken interest in the meeting, and might attend. There is now a possibility PSNH legal representative, Godwin & Proctor, will also be at the meeting. I emphasized to Allan Palmer this meeting was not to be a negotiation or a discussion between Region 1 and PSNH et. al. I reiterated that PSNH requested the meeting and EPA agreed to listen to PSNH's presentation; not to negotiate permit limits.

Again, the meeting is now scheduled for December 4, 10:00-12:00.
