## Self Assessment

Public Education: The Town has done well to meet our public outreach goals. Although fiscal constraints interfered with Earth Day activities, our voluntary participation program to clean street areas of rubbish, etc. We are re-evaluating ways to address Stream clean up.

### Public Participation:

Our Advisory Committee is comprised of the Land Use Coordinator, Conservation Agent and Highway Superintendent.

The Town's Hazardous Waste Collection day has been highly successful. Budget cuts have continued to limit the amount of waste we can take in. The event is well advertised and participation is very good. Unfortunately, we had had to turn vehicles away.

Waste Oil Collection is conducted the first Saturday of every month. Participation is high and the oil collected is recycled for use at our Highway Department.

### Illicit Discharge and Receiving Waters.

Again, fiscal cutbacks have not allowed for the purchasing of any GPS equipment. The Highway Superintendent has record of Outfalls and Receiving Waters but we are lacking the resources to create professional mapping.

We have established a Bylaw Review Committee. The process has been slow but steady. A report is expected to be finalized at the end of 2004. Until we complete this exercise we are not ready to move forward with bylaw presentation.

### Construction Site Runoff Control

Current practices are being review. This is an area we need improvement. Our Conservation Agent makes continued site inspections on all on-going projects with orders of conditions. In most cases, sites are managed well. The Commission has formed a sub-committee to review regulations. Recommendation for bylaw will follow and be forwarded to the Bylaw Review Committee.

### Post Construction Runoff Control

Again progress toward bylaw recommendation is awaiting the first phase of our Bylaw Review.

### Municipal Good Housekeeping

Despite being unable to fund replacing an employee the Highway Department has completed its annual street sweeping. The Highway Department also cleaned catch basins annually versus once every two years.

Site Visits included the Fire Department. Good practices were found to be in place. In FY05 a new fire station will be completed and the washing of all equipment will take place at this site where there is a contained drain system.
