

Part II. Self-Assessment

The Town of Leicester has successfully implemented or begun implementation of several Measurable Goals noted in its Notice-of-Intent. Prior to the development of Leicester's Comprehensive Storm Water Management Program, including Measurable Goals, the Town had an assessment performed of current activities, programs, and regulations that could support the NPDES Phase II Storm Water Program. This assessment became the basis for modifying current activities, recommending new programs, and informing town boards and departments of their obligation toward successful implementation of Leicester's Comprehensive Storm Water Program.

Leicester is pleased to present the following summary describing its success at implementing the third year of the Town's Comprehensive Storm Water Management Program.
