

Part II. Self-Assessment

2005 - The Town has made progress or completed some activity for the majority of the proposed BMP's for the third year. There was "No Activity" for 5 BMP's with scheduled activity during this year, but some of this was offset by activity in other areas not originally proposed. The changes to the Planning Board and Sub-Division Regulations are still pending, however, now that the Town By-Law Review and Revision process is complete, the Town can now also begin the process of developing regulations and procedures to implement and enforce a Storm Water Program. Developing the drafts for these regulations will be the primary focus for year 4.

South Hadley is now also a member of the newly formed Connecticut River Stormwater Subcommittee (CRSS). This is a subcommittee of the Connecticut River Cleanup Committee (CRCC) of which South Hadley is also a member. Both committees are in conjunction with the Pioneer Valley Planning Commission (PVPC). The Stormwater Subcommittee is comprised of eight member communities. Together with the PVPC, the group will work together to develop public education materials and a public outreach campaign to meet the requirements of the NPDES Phase II regulations on both a community and regional scale.
