Part II. Self-Assessment

The Town of Templeton has made considerable progress in its third year of implementation of some major Measurable Goals noted in its Notice of Intent. Prior to the development of its Comprehensive Stormwater Management Program, including Measurable Goals, the Town had an assessment performed of current activities, programs, and regulations that could support the NPDES Phase II Stormwater program. This assessment has become the basis for modifying and changing current activities, recommending new programs, and informing town boards and departments of their obligation toward successful implementation of Templeton's Comprehensive Stormwater Program.

In accordance with Templeton's Comprehensive Stormwater Management Program the town has continued to implement the Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination (IDDE) Program in Permit Year 4. The major accomplishment was the completion of the identification and mapping of over 90% of the outfalls to date. The town has mapped all of the Stormwater Outfalls and Culverts with the exception of Dudley road which is undergoing reconstruction. Areas of concern such as dry weather flow, stains, sedimentation, and vegetative growth have also been identified and mapped. The town highway department is drafting a plan to prioritize remediation actions. Approximately 90% of the Stormwater infrastructure (catch basins, dropped inlets, culverts and manholes) have been mapped with the completion of the project slated for permit year 5. Copies of the NPDES Phase II Stormwater Management Plan 2007 Status Report for Permit Year 4 along with the associated maps are attached to this report.

Templeton is pleased to present the following summary describing its success at implementing the fourth year of the Comprehensive Stormwater Management program.
