Part II. Self-Assessment

The Town of Barnstable has completed the required self-assessment and has determined that our municipality is working towards compliance as we implement our Stormwater Management Program as described in the NOI dated July 28, 2003. The attached Summary of Minimum Control Measures describes steps taken to date.

The Town of Barnstable has addressed stormwater issues for many years. Some of the projects that have been ongoing for many years include street sweeping, catch basin cleaning, illegal discharge location, water quality monitoring, outfall mapping, coastal discharge mitigation, shellfish sanitary surveys, and participation in the Massachusetts Estuary Project (MEP) and the Cape Cod Commission Project Storm.

A citizen committee was formed to help with public information and to address issues dealing with stormwater and water quality concerns. The Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC) deals with a range of water quality issues and solutions to prevent problems now and in the future.
