Under site-plan review, The Town of Dracut requires all development - new and/or redevelopment to submit As-built drawings. "As-built plans shall be provided upon completion of the project and prior to the receipt of an occupancy permit. As-built plans shall be prepared in accordance with requirements of the Rules and Regulations governing the Subdivision of Land in Dracut, MA, as amended."

## Street Design and Parking Lots Report

Describe the status of the street design and parking lots assessment due in year 4 of the permit term, including any planned or completed changes to local regulations and guidelines:

The Dracut Planning Board recently adopted new subdivision rules and regulations for the community. One of the key changes was allowing proposed streets to be less than 30' in width, which was the requirement in the former regulations. The new regulations allow for the Planning Board to allow for a street width of down to 24' in width, resulting in much less stormwater generated from the street and less infrastructure to address

the street drainage. Additionally, the site plan review process references these new subdivision rules and regulations for guidance on how to address stormwater and other facets of stormwater drainage and mitigation. Large parking lots are required to meet stormwater standards and mitigation options noted in these new subdivision rules and regulations. The new regulations allow for more flexibility and options and are available at the Engineering and Planning Department and at the Middlesex North Registry of Deeds, Book 34472, page 1. The new rules and regulations were adopted on August 10, 2020.

#### Green Infrastructure Report

The Dracut Planning Board recently adopted new subdivision rules and regulations for the community. One of the key changes was allowing Low Impact Development options to address stormwater treatment. Additionally, the site plan review process references these new subdivision rules and regulations for guidance on how to address stormwater in a much more creative manner than past regulations have allowed. The new regulations allow for more flexibility and options and are available at the Engineering and Planning Department and at the Middlesex North Registry of Deeds, Book 34472, page 1. The new rules and regulations were adopted on August 10, 2020.
