Vacant Aerovox Building Needs to be Demolished to Keep Neighborhood Safe from Threat of Air Emissions Due to Fire

EPA's 2006 Supplemental Engineering Evaluation and Cost Analysis is a study of the site's contamination and an analysis of five short-term cleanup options which all assume continued commercial/industrial use. It recommends "New Alternative #1" which calls for the building's demolition and the disposal of the demolition waste on-site under a protective cap. The full report is available for review at:
