I just got off the phone with Scott Alphonse regarding the incidences of trespass into the Aerovox Property. During my last trip into Aerovox, there was evidence that someone had turned on the heat in two zones of the front office and had slept there at least one night. Someone had also gotten in and turned on every circuit panel and powered up every light in the building. Some of these circuits charge some significant equipment (ie heaters, high voltage rooms, etc.) and pose a fire hazard since a lot of the electrical system has been vandalized. There has also been some skateboard ramp set up in the parking lot.

With that said, Scott was looking at the ease at which he could get under our temporary fence which Severson placed to accommodate piping deployment and the dredge lines leading from the ferric tank. He asked how the city could install permanent fencing which would accommodate our dredging needs. Do we still need the temporary fence arraignment? Scott asked if they could install permanent gates in this area. I told him that once our dredge

lines were installed, the gates would be open for 3 or 4 months. I told him I would talk to our contractor to see what their needs are in this area.

Mike, can you get Severson's thoughts on this? Can we live with pipe line running through a small hole in the fabric of a permanent fence located along the old fence line? We should bring this up in the teleconference tomorrow.
