As one of the 18 residents immediately involved with the proposed clean-up of Allendale Pond, I have followed with great interest the 30 years involvement of the EPA with this section of the Woonasquatucket River in Centredale RI.

I am delighted that the thirty year EPA involvement with toxic contamination of the Woonasquatucket and its floodplain soil is perhaps a step further towards efficacious action. Despite anticipated years of unpleasant aggravations of dump trucks, noise, dust, dead vegetations and missing bird, fish, and wildlife, the ultimate aim of removing hazards from the grounds beneath our feet and waters beneath our canoes.

I may have problems with their implemenation, but I have no problem with the intent of the proposed plan called Centredale Manor Restoration Project, North Providence, RI.

I do, however, have a major problem with the continued operation of an asphalt plant in the same location on the Woonasquatucket River.
