Dear Ms. Krasko:

One of the biggest concerns that was mentioned during the meetings is the health risk for people who walk along the pond, boat on the pond, fish in the pond, or swim in the pond. Currently, there is really no "designated" public access to any part of this pond or area and it has been said that even after the clean-up of a cost of between \$100 - \$150M, best estimate, that walking, boating, fishing, or swimming may still be a health risk. There is no reason to do this project. Currently, there are many posted signs that warn against any of these activities on the ponds. And in the last decade we can count, on one hand, how many people use this pond and area that is proposed to be cleaned.

We as residents who live on the pond or close to the pond feel it would be obtrusive to our way of living, to the ecological impact which is vibrant and active at this time, and most importantly to the economic impact not only to the businesses which the US Government will strong-arm to get the money from, but also to the future taxpayers of the residents who live on the proposed area.

We oppose this proposal for these reasons.
