My comments in response to the Lower Harbor Confined Aquatic Disposal (CAD) Cell Draft Explanation of Significant Differences (2010 Draft CAD Cell ESD), released June 2010 that proposes that 300,000 cubic yards of PCB contaminated sediment be buried below the riverbed in CAD cells to expedite and economize the remediation process of the Acushnet Estuary Superfund site:

The children of greater New Bedford should not be forsaken for the sake of time and/or money.

Do not stop removing the PCB's from the Acushnet River! Without removing the contaminants completely, the threat will not be removed. Burying them deeper in the river would, clearly, be moving things in the wrong direction (deeper in, not out).

I want the EPA to carry out the original plans to clean the River by removing the contaminants out of the area; presently to a Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA) licensed facility in Michigan.

I find it abhorrent that the US government would turn their back on New Bedford, once again, by trying to leave what was dumped on us in the 1940's -1970's (part of which was caused by government contracts).
