We are reviewing EPA's comments for the Draft Permit. One of the notes associated with Item #2 states "Flag the high tide line in the field".

Is this just for the mitigation areas (the note seems to be listed under "location of various plantings on mitigation site plans"), or do you want the Commonwealth to flag the high tide line on the whole project, prior to you getting onsite?

If you mean for the whole project, many of our flags placed around the salt marsh area washed away relatively quickly.

If we go out and flag the high tide line, can we make sure that EPA is onsite either that day or perhaps the next day to make sure that the flags are still there?
