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INTRODUCTION

This document is the Index to the Administrative Record File for the Troy Mills Landfill Site Removal Action. The Index cites site-specific documents and guidance documents used by U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) staff in selecting a removal action at the site. Removal activities will protect public health, welfare, and the environment, and include performing a site walk with Emergency Rapid Response Services (ERRS) contractor personnel, New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services (NHDES) officials, and Town of Troy officials. Furthermore, this removal action will include a limited removal of drums, as well as the construction of a temporary interceptor system to contain the migration of hazardous substances [volatile organic compounds (VOCs), semivolatile organic compounds (SVOCs), and inorganic substances (including metals)]. Removal activities relating to the interceptor system will include performing preliminary excavations at the base of the (landfill) slope to provide data points for the design of the interceptor system; supporting design studies for the interceptor system; and implementing the interceptor system. NHDES has agreed to operate and maintain the interceptor system.

The Administrative Record File is required by the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA), 42 U.S.C. § 9613 (k), and EPA's implementing regulations, 40 CFR § 300.800.-825.
