



Construction Begins Soon in Revenue Gulch




Coeur d'Alene Basin Cleanup

May 2015

Construction of drainage improvements to protect completed cleanup work in Silverton is getting started. Staking and surveying begins the week of May 11. Actual construction work will start in early June. The project should be done this year before winter.

Subsurface stormwater drains will be installed on 6th, 7th, 8th, and 9th Streets between Western and Markwell. Six driveway crossings over Revenue Creek will be upgraded. And a subsurface Revenue Creek overflow pipeline will be installed along Markwell between 9th and 1st. Paving will take place on each of the impacted streets.

There will be noise. Regular working hours will be between 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. You will notice big construction equipment and trucks that will require temporary road closures and traffic detours. The contractor will notify affected residents before closing roads or limiting property access. We know that work poses an inconvenience to residents. Thank you for your patience while we work in your neighborhood. Please contact us if you have concerns.



The Work Helps Keep Cleaned Up Areas Clean

Remedy Protection projects like this one help to protect work already done as part of the Coeur d'Alene Basin Cleanup. They help keep cleaned up areas clean and reduce the chance that people will be exposed to contamination. The upgrades to local infrastructure that are a part of remedy protection also help protect private and public property from flooding and storm water runoff.

The Coeur d'Alene Trust, IDEQ, and EPA coordinate this and other Remedy Protection projects with local jurisdictions and property owners. The project is funded by settlement money and does not use local funds.

Drainage improvement work includes a new stream overflow and storm drain system, overflow inlet structures, and concrete box culverts.
