Compliance Assistance Activities

FCEAP maintains a website which includes information pertaining to EAP's permitting program (<http://www.forsyth.cc/EAP/>). The website is reviewed periodically to ensure the accuracy of all the information available at the site and addition is posted as it comes available. Information on the site includes:

- Permit application and registration forms,
- Forms for inventories, modeling, performance testing, and annual compliance certifications,
- Fees,
- Current Air Quality Technical Code,
- Links to sites for additional regulatory information and emission estimation.
- Public notices for permits and proposed county regulations.

This Office works directly with all permitted facilities by assigning the management of all permitting & compliance activities to specific Case Managers. This system provides facilities with a single contact in this Office who is familiar with their operations and air quality obligations. Case managers are available to answer questions from facility contacts and received 132 requests for regulatory consultations in the fourth quarter of FFY 2013. Letters are also sent to remind permitted facilities when they are required to submit renewal applications.

This Office also provides compliance assistance using registrations for Gasoline Dispensing Stations (Stage I), Dry Cleaners using Perchloroethylene, and Miscellaneous Coating Operations. There are currently 210 registered Stage I facilities 23 registered Dry Cleaning facilities, and 76 Miscellaneous Coating Operations.

In addition to the ongoing efforts described above, resources continue to be applied to providing outreach and compliance assistance to previously unregulated facilities that are or will be affected by recently promulgated area source MACT standards. Efforts are ongoing to identify facilities subject to Area Source MACT standards and provide compliance assistance as resources allow. Particular emphasis will now be directed to provide assistance for the recently finalized rules for boilers and engines. Specifically, this Office is developing a webpage and registration program to provide compliance assistance to owners/operators of emergency engines under RICE NESHAP and NSPS rules
