

## North Carolina Division of Air Quality Compliance Assistance Activities

FFY – 2014

### MACT/GACT Activities

The DAQ has formed a MACT task force to facilitate the implementation of 112(d) MACT and GACT standards. The MACT task force identifies permitted facilities, and in some cases unpermitted facilities, potentially subject to the area source GACTs that have been promulgated. Once the facilities are identified, the task force mails informational letters to these facilities asking them to submit initial notifications and compliance notifications, if applicable. The following compliance assistance activities occurred in FFY-2014.

- To facilitate outreach to the regulated community, the MACT/GACT webpage was continually updated with information on rules including:
    - Industrial, Commercial, and Institutional Boilers & Process Heaters at Area Sources (Subpart 6J)
    - Reciprocating Internal Combustion Engines (Subpart 4Z)
